David was a shepherd boy, but Samuel planted the seeds of kingship in his mind. The lion, the bear and Goliath provided opportunities to show leadership and caused Israel to defeat the Philistines. David inspired not only his generation but many generations to come. Good leaders bring out the supernatural in natural people.

WISDOM FROM THE *Word* FULFILLING YOUR DESTINY – PART ELEVEN

Ephesians 1:7 *"In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace."*

The word *redemption* is a noun referring to land, possessions or people that have been bought.

Just as when a person has to pay a dowry to get married, so Jesus, the Son of God, paid a dowry to get His bride – and that bride was us. In India, without a dowry, a young lady cannot get married; so oftentimes, poor families will kill their little girls because they know they can't afford to pay the dowry. Many false religions require human sacrifices to buy their forgiveness, salvation or answers to prayer. Islam, for example, believes that the highest sacrifice is to blow yourself up to get 72 virginians (I mean virgins) to get eternal life. The Christian needs salvation also; the difference is that God sent His only begotten Son to buy us back from Satan. Jesus paid the price – Himself. The word *redemption* connotes a deliverance and a freedom. When Christ died for us, He set us free from sin, Satan, the world and mostly ourselves. There are a number of truths that we can dig out of this revelation of redemption in the context of fulfilling our destiny.

1. If God would give us His only Son, would He not give us all things? I would rather lose everything than to lose my child or spouse or friend. Yet the Father gave us His Son, and the Son willingly gave Himself for us. May this give us faith to believe that God will help us fulfill our destiny because He loves us so much, and He will give us everything we need to fulfill our destiny.

2. We have infinite motivation to fulfill the destiny God has for us, because He loves us so much. The Bible teaches that the love of Christ compels us (2 Cor. 5:14-15). Sometimes people think we are crazy for our hard work and sacrifice, but it is minute compared to how much God has done for me and how Jesus sacrificed Himself for my sins. I can't help but love people because I am redeemed by His blood. I may get frustrated or discouraged, but I am never burned out, because His love compels me.

3. Because God bought me with such a high price, I am infinitely valuable as a child of God; therefore, any unworthiness is washed away because of His redemption. I can say to myself, "You are unstoppable because of His redemption." Any lack is yanked from my heart, and I can achieve all things through Christ who strengthens me.

4. Because of His redemption, I am free from sin that prevents God's blessings. I am free from deafness so I can hear the word of God. I am free from poverty because I have the resources to accomplish His work. I am free from weariness because His energy works powerfully in me. I am free from guilt because I have no more condemnation. I am free from iniquities because they have been buried in the deepest sea. I am free from laziness, because I am created to do good works. I am free from selfishness because his love compels me. I am free from negativity because I have the mind of Christ. I am free!!!

Honduras Highlights

Report from Dr. Teresa The corn fields are looking very nice at the farm in Honduras. Oscar and the children work hard to keep the farm going. The garden is weeded by the children. We pay them to work and they love it. They planted watermelons, tomatoes and other vegetables. It was cute to see them everyday sitting around the watermelon plants, watching how they grow. They are proud of their work. They are learning to appreciate work and take care of the plants. Oscar bought two calves and is working on fencing the area. Soon we won't have to buy meat any more. Thank you, Jesus. Pastor Julio is coming once a week to visit the children at the orphanage and have church services. The kids love Pastor Julio. He will also be preaching to construction workers and teachers.

Please pray for the children; they have been sick with the flu. Between ten and fifteen children were taken to the doctor. Also pray for our little Lixi, the 20-month-old twin. The doctor said she cannot be around the rest of the children because they are sick. Her recovery is going very slow and she needs 24/7 personalized care. Reyna has taken the baby to her house and gives her all the care and attention she needs. Pray she gets better every day. If anybody would like to sponsor Lixi, that would be great because her medical bills are coming non-stop.

New partnership formed In Zechariah, we read about the children playing. We are pleased to announce that Bruce and Deanna Franta from Austin, MN, together with Pastor Kurt Verhoeven from Elkhorn, WI, want to buy a huge playground set, like those found in our parks and schools. The cost is approximately \$30,000. Our kids have been so abused, but what a blessing it is to buy them a beautiful refurbished playground set. We have found a dollar-for-dollar matching grant. After one week, our partners have raised \$1,000 plus a matching grant of \$1,000 (7.5% of the total needed). We have only \$28,000 to go. To participate in a child's joy mark **playground** on your check.

IMI's new missionaries Jim and Lyn Moomey, from the Milwaukee area, will be joining the staff of our Honduras orphanage. Jim will oversee the new water purification plant that will be installed in August. Lyn and Jim will also assist with the general operation of the orphanage. They have an interest in teaching the older orphans job skills, as well as developing profit-making projects that will help sustain the orphanage financially. Lyn and Jim started their fundraising campaign in June. They are anticipating a one-week trip to the orphanage in early September. They will return for one month to work with Tom and Teresa in the United States. In October, they plan to permanently make their home in Honduras. The Moomey's have two children – Hannah, 21, and David, 18.

Missions building projects

School – The school is coming along quite well. They are finishing the roof as we speak. They are also finishing the sheetrock on the walls. We hope to have it finished by the end of August. \$13,000 is still needed. To donate, mark **orphanage** on your check.

Kitchen – They are now finishing the interior of the kitchen and installing the windows. We thank God for the \$5,000 gift from one of our missionaries to complete the kitchen. The nannies were crammed into a small hot area, but now they will have plenty of space to make good healthy food for the children and our workers.

Agriculture The corn is growing like crazy. We should have enough corn for the tortillas for the rest of the year. Thanks to Rick Jumpa and the crew from Chicago, we now have two cows that we want to get impregnated to have calves so we can have meat for the kids. We are also trying to buy a milk cow. Also, we just ordered another 100 fruit

trees. We thank God for Pastor Oscar running our farm. Please keep him in prayer. Our goal, as far as food, is to not only be self-sufficient but also to begin selling food to our neighbors. To donate, mark **farm** on your check.

Plant a tree and multiply your giving A five-dollar tree can produce hundreds or more pieces of fruit each year. If a tree produces for ten years, your five dollars will be multiplied to \$1,000. We can purchase 22 trees per every hundred dollars donated. For a minimum of a hundred dollars, we will put a sign of your favorite person there. We've planted over 400 trees so far.



Our goal in one year is to have all of the food supply for our orphanage and church members to be met and to have enough to sell to the community. We have 36 kinds of fruits, vegetables, grains and meat to raise. Each month we want to knock off three of these, so that in one year we will be growing everything needed to meet our increasing expenses.

Mission trip testimonies

– **Matthew & Irene Witt from Ellijay, GA** There's not one single thing we can point to that touched us the most. All of it was an amazing experience, very eye-opening. The level of poverty in the country is staggering, yet the people are so loving and grateful and thankful and faithful. We enjoyed the spirit-filled services at Pastor Julio's church. My first visit was seven years ago when there was only one orphanage/feeding center. It was awesome to see all of the progress and new orphanage/buildings since my first visit. This completely reinforces that all of the donations go directly to impact the orphans. It was refreshing to see so many missionaries coming together from all different parts of the USA to work together to make a difference. The lack of fresh, clean water was shocking, and it has made us think about how we waste water back home. Another part of our visit was visiting the landfill. This greatly saddened our hearts that people have to resort to going there to scrounge for scraps for money. This trip has encouraged us to begin thinking of new ways to help and we want to come back next year. We will be better prepared next year, too!

– **Cathy Gray from Kauai, HI** We saw God's love in action and the unity of the body of Christ working together to bring the love of God from heaven to earth to provide for the needs of the Honduran people and, of course, the orphans. The medical needs are tremendous and overwhelming, yet we treated over 390 patients in five days. This is my second mission trip here. I never felt comfortable about asking people for financial support for this trip or our first trip. But now after this one, I am totally in faith about asking people for financial support with anything to do with the orphans, including sponsoring our next trip down there. God has opened the eyes of my heart even more. We as Christians are to not only pray for the orphans, but to DO something about it as well. If we can't go, or don't want to go, then we need to support or sponsor someone who is willing to go. My favorite part was holding, hugging, playing with and loving on these beautiful children. It was an incredible privilege.

The City of Refuge is growing A third family is going to Honduras to build their house. Do you trust the government? Do you want a beautiful vacation home? Do you want a house fully paid off? Another crunch is coming – pray about building in Honduras. It's approximately \$30 a square foot.

Around the World

IMI has begun a new building project in Bangladesh We have just sent our second \$1,000 offering to Bangladesh, and we are excited about educating and feeding Christian children as well as reaching out to the children in other religions. The land has been leveled, and Rev. Lawrence informed me that he is ready to begin putting in the footings. Next month, we will send photos of the progress of this project. Can you help us complete this school? The school will be for all ages. We will have eighty children going to school and getting fed. To build in **Bangladesh** mark it on your check and get your name and photo on the wall.

Jeremiah Mahananda in India thanks IMI for their prayers and support He reports that many people are coming to the Lord Jesus Christ to receive Him as their personal savior, and four have been baptized this month. He teaches them the Word of God and goes to nearby villages on bicycle, preaching the Gospel and distributing tracts. Sometimes, people of other religions oppose and threaten this pastor in order to bring fear. Even though they persecute and have tried to kill him, God has saved Pastor Mahananda and uses him in miracles. Please pray for his family and ministry.

From a report by Santosh Mali in India During the last month, people were baptized and God healed over 45 sick people. With God's help, they distributed tracts and New Testaments among fifteen new villages, visited seven hospitals to pray and arranged prayer groups in four villages. Some testimonies include a broken leg recovered in two months instead of a year, a lady close to death healed of chest pains and a baby who couldn't talk now healed and talking. Your prayers and financial support help this ministry continue to bring God's blessings to India. With thankful hearts, they pray for their IMI partners and glorify God for His mighty works.

Honduras construction projects accomplished so far in 2013

- Three bathrooms for our workers and missionaries are completed at our city.
- We finished a septic system.
- We set up over twelve to fifteen 40-foot electric poles.
- Our large boys orphanage is completed.
- We finished a two-bedroom house.
- We also finished a one-bedroom house.

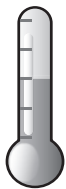
- The walls around our medical clinic in Honduras are half-finished.
- We now have ten-foot high walls around our retail center in Honduras.
- We are building a school with eight classrooms in Honduras. Cement walls are up and they are now finishing the roof.
- The new kitchen building project in Honduras is 90% finished.
- We are building a school in Bangladesh (20% completed).
- We are building a gymnasium in the Philippines (25% completed).
- We built sidewalks for our Honduras compound.

Serving southeast Asia IMI minister, Rev. Doug Nelson, and his wife Jill led a short term mission team to MaeSae, Thailand, on the Golden Triangle in January. The team assisted another ministry in the construction of a dormitory for a training and refreshment center to serve indigenous ministers throughout southeast Asia, including a number of countries with restricted access. The vision for the center is large, necessitating the acquisition of much property, and will eventually include a refuge and vocational training center for trafficked women and children. The Nelsons are organizing another team to go there again this coming January. Prayer support is appreciated! They would like to bring both a medical team and a construction team.

IMI hits the 2.3 million meals mark through July 30th With the generous help of God's people, we have now been able to provide almost two million meals this year. Thanks to God and His people, IMI has paid shipping on *330,000 meals to the Philippines each of the last five months*. To help out mark **food** on your offering check.

We were able to send a forty-foot container of food to the Philippines through our partner – Risen Savior Missions. Thanks for your support in feeding 6,000 children. We would like to be able to do this every month, if possible.

Report from the Philippines Risen Savior Missions and Feed My Starving Children distributes Manna Pack Rice to families in the Philippines through local Catholic churches and outreaches. They tell of the joy of impoverished parents receiving this fortified food for their sickly, malnourished children and seeing noticeable improvement in their health and growth in as short as a month's time. Risen Savior Missions is grateful for IMI's partnership in offering hope and a brighter future to these children.
