WISDOM FROM THE *Word*
FULFILLING YOUR DESTINY - PART SIXTEEN

"That he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding." Ephesians 1:8

Attaining Wisdom - Solomon taught, "Wisdom is the principle thing; therefore get wisdom." How do you get wisdom?

1. James tells us, "If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask of God...and it will be given to him." We have not because we ask not. We need to cry out for wisdom - in fact, in Proverbs it says that wisdom cries aloud. It's almost like two lovebirds singing out to each other. Also, when I spend time with God, He will reveal Himself as wisdom. Prayer and worship will result in attaining heavenly wisdom. Paul tells us that we walk in heavenly places.

Honduras Highlights



February 2014

Largest non-July mission trip ever We were blessed to have my sister and my nephew come with us to Honduras. Two years ago, my niece Sophia came and was so blessed she quit attending her secular college, and now, she is working for YWAM full-time. We also had Brian Gray; Gayle Mitzel with her niece from Hawaii; Rev. Michael McDermont from Illinois; Ray Vickers, Charles Fisher, and Michael with his granddaughter from Mt. Vernon, OH; Bruce and Deanna Franta from Austin, MN; my son Phil with his wife Jessie from Baraboo, WI; Rev. Jeff Kapelle with his daughter and two teens from Tolna, ND; Kelly, Chris, Pamula, Donna with her daughter, Jordan with his girlfriend, Luke, Sarah, Leea, Dr. Ron Graef, Barb, and a teenager from Ottumwa, IA; Rev. Walter Groff from Des Moines, Rev. Sean Hart from Monmouth, IL; Rev. Kurt Verhoeven with his wife Karen and their four children from Elkhorn, WI; Rev. Bob Shank from Madison, WI; the Gustafson family from Neenah, WI; and Rev. Doug Gerhart with his family from Rochester, MN. Thank you, Jesus!

Glory to God!!! Missionaries blessed the children with their construction skills *The playground is finished!!! It was a team effort.* It started with Deanna Franta getting a vision to build an IMI playground for our children and even the kids in the community. She started raising money. Then Dr. Tim Peterson helped us raise \$30,000 for the playground. Rev. Kurt Verhoeven drew up the plans. Rev. Matthew Darnell and his church dug the footings for the basketball court. Then Pastor Kurt Verhoeven and his family, Rev. Shaun Hart, Ray Vickers, Charles Fisher, the Schulz/Christian family and Dr. Ron Graef finished it. The \$30,000 that was given paid for a brand new cement mixer, the basketball court, basketball hoops, our beautiful new gazebo, swings, slides, monkey bars, etc. What a joy to see our children squealing with delight going down the slides and enjoying us pushing them on the swings. Brian Gray explained it best – “fun therapy” heals children. Positive experiences will turn into positive memories and help heal negative experiences and horrible memories.

Honduras mission building projects

School – Praise God, the children are moved out of their small four-room schoolhouse to a brand new large school with ten rooms. We extended the roof and that will be done in a week. Then they will touch up the paint. It is completely finished. We are currently building the fifty desks for the school. Many people believe this is the most beautiful building we have built. We are also pleased to announce that we have five students from the community that are paying to come to our school because of our high-quality education and because the school is bilingual. Our goal is to make our school totally self-sufficient.

IMI retail center – The footings have been put in for the ten hotel rooms, three stores and restaurant, plus the sewage system is being dug. This is the non-fun part of building, and yet if you don't have a good foundation, your building will collapse. Our goal is to have it finished by May. This one big step toward self-sufficiency for orphans when I am no longer here.

New construction: storage room – We no longer need the old kitchen, so now we are going to enclose the kitchen and turn it into a storage area. This will give us an extra room in our girls orphanage to house our children as they are packed in four rooms. Our construction crew from Ohio is going try to nail it out (no pun intended). All of our tools will be organized and under lock and key so that our missionaries will be ready to build without tools “walking away”.

Major problem solved, thanks to our missionaries and friends As you probably know, the electricity in most third-world nations is a serious problem. On New Year's Eve, we were setting up to have a revival service at the City of Refuge when the electricity went out. This also happened a month ago when we were passing out presents to our children. But God moved on my friend Ray Vicker's heart, and he stated that we needed \$6,500 to buy a generator to keep the power on for safety, activities, outreach and for the food in our freezer and refrigerator. He said that he would give a \$1,000. Praise God! With the help of the missionaries and brother Mike from Mt. Vernon, OH, we raised over \$5,000. So by faith, I told Teresa to go buy it. We were blessed to have an electrician, named Charles from Mt. Vernon, install it. God is good!!! If you want to help pay for the rest of the **generator**, it's only \$1,500 more.

Thank you, Jesus The Assembly of God church in Rochester, MN donated \$4800 to buy cows.

IMI invests in an ATV in Honduras My son said that if we get an ATV, it will save us a lot of money for the orphanage. So we bought a small one. Instead of driving up town to get things, we can take the ATV. Phil took three trips into town and saved us a lot of money. Gas is \$6.00 a gallon. Or when we haul wood or small things, we don't need to take a large tractor, we can take the ATV and save a lot of gasoline and wear and tear on the tractor.

Needs for the orphanage

- Crib mattresses - six at \$35 each
- Twin mattresses - eighteen at \$50 each
- Closet storage for the boys dorms - six at \$240 each
- Large freezer - \$780
- Another washing machine - \$600
- Computers for the school - four at \$500 each

Missionary testimonies Barb from Ottumwa, IA –

I've been blessed to have had the opportunity to see the prior two homes IMI has used to house our kids. The progress that has been made in providing for these precious children has been due to one miracle of God's provision after another accomplished through the people God uses to contribute to this ministry. Visiting the original orphanage reminded me of the excitement

we experienced in moving the kids to their next home. Now, to see the current property and the number of kids being cared for is simply overwhelming. The need is so great to raise these children. The evidence of success is apparent in a young man named Carlos. When I was here in 2008, he was one of our kids. I had the privilege of seeing him on this trip to now find he is a family man with a wife and a three-month-old baby and is diligently serving in the church. Another example of success is Adriana, our first high school graduate who is heading for medical school. We have been Facebook friends for a little while, and when we met, she gave me the longest, tightest hug! Looking her in the eye and telling her I'm proud of her was a priceless moment I'll cherish forever. Going home is going to be very difficult. Thank you, Tom and Teresa, for being so diligent with your passion for these kids.

Shawn Hart from Monmouth, IL – After seeing the videos and hearing Tom's heart for the children, you are unable to really know how much he loves the children until you see the children run to him when he arrives. Being here in Honduras for the first time was amazing – as you walk around, there is a peace that hovers over this City of Refuge. It is a peace of hope and love. I would challenge everyone to come and walk among the children and experience the peace and love that is there.

Honduras

Agriculture We have hired engineers to lay out our irrigation system. I have learned a lot. Instead of guessing what grows where, we are having the experts come in and help us. I've always shied away from paying for technology, but countries that have a lot of technology get way more bang for the buck. So there is upfront money, but it will pay off for decades. We will have our irrigation system put in in January. And we have ten boys who are learning to farm. The hundreds of fruit trees are growing, and we produced enough corn for the year. Between the rows of corn, we planted acres and acres of black and red beans, enough to last six months. We just spent \$1,500 for more fencing to have more cattle. Currently, we are getting plans for our irrigation system. Then we can bid it out and have six more months of growing season. We already have the pump (cost \$10,000); now we need to buy pipes and tanks, filters and other items to set up the system. To donate, mark **farm or irrigation system** on your check.

Help send an orphan to college – *Our oldest child is ready.* I've heard this quote hundreds of times: Give a fish, and you feed a person for a day; teach them to fish, and you will feed them for a lifetime. Adriana's mom was sold into prostitution by her mom. Seven years ago when we opened up our first orphanage, Adriana and her sisters came to live with us. After staying with us for a short time, their grandma convinced Adriana's sisters to come back to live with her. And she put them into prostitution. Adriana chose to live with us. She is a wonderful Christian lady who walks with God. She goes to school full-time, has excellent grades and works as a nanny for some of the children. Her dream is to be a medical doctor. How would you like to change the world by sponsoring Adriana? Our goal is to put as many as our children through college as we can. If you want to help, label your gift **college - Adriana**.

Important development for the City of Refuge *Phase One* is finished, and we now have a road all the way back to the end of the property. What a joy to be able to go all the way back and not have to walk it! The mountain and ravine views are truly breathtaking. It's a beautiful road, and as Rev. Doug Gerhart says, "It's a romantic drive." We are excited about *Phase Two* of our road project. Our contractor is currently clearing the top of the first hill to build a lodge, and then he will begin the road into the interior of the property. Because of the ravines and steep hills, nothing is straight and we will be building many bridges. We will then put up signs for building plots. *Phase Three* is another interior road. In *Phase Four*, we will be putting on soil that will need to be compacted. Eventually, we will use cobblestone or cement for *Phase Five*. The city is developing. Plus, we will be building condos to help people who are low on finances to have a ministry home, vacation home or place of refuge.

Why build in the City of Refuge?

- As of now, no property taxes
- Live with other committed Christians
- Tropical environment with no mosquitoes
- Gated community
- Love on the orphans, help out at a church, spend time loving God's people
- Have fun – there's soccer, fishing, hunting, shooting, games, fellowship, playing with the kids, ATV riding, hiking and golfing (fifteen minutes from a golf course)
- It's in the mountains, close to the beach, three hours from both coasts and has the second most beautiful coral reef in the world
- \$30 a square foot – built with cement and tile
- Honduras has no drones, no speed cameras and it is very libertarian – the freedom is so refreshing
- Start a business with almost no regulations and taxes
- No snow or icy roads
- Opportunities to love others
- Live in the country and in the mountains
- Become self-sufficient

Healthy Tips from Dr. Teresa



Neurobics for your mind. Get your brain fizzing with energy. American researchers coined the term 'neurobics' for tasks which activate the brain's own biochemical pathways and to bring new pathways online that can help to strengthen or preserve brain circuits. Brush your teeth with your 'other' hand, take a new route to work or choose your clothes based on sense of touch rather than sight. People with mental agility tend to have lower rates of Alzheimer's disease and age-related mental decline.



Get spiritual. A study conducted by the formidably sober and scientific Harvard University found that patients who were prayed for recovered quicker than those who weren't, even if they weren't aware of the prayer.



Do your weights workout first. Experts say weight training should be done first, because it's a higher intensity exercise compared to cardio. Your body is better able to handle weight training early in the workout because you're fresh and you have the energy you need to work it. Conversely, cardiovascular exercise should be the last thing you do at the gym, because it helps your body recover by increasing blood flow to the muscles and flushing out lactic acid which builds up in the muscles while you're weight training. It's the lactic acid that makes your muscles feel stiff and sore.

Bangladesh school update Our missionary to Bangladesh, Kris Palmer, is taking a team in February. They are looking forward to ministering to 120 children who are attending our Christian school amongst Hindus and Muslims. The children in Laudov are patiently waiting for their new building to be completed, which our team hopes to see as well. Pastor Lawrence has purchased the materials. There have been major rain delays, but one of the walls has been started. As soon as the rainy season is over, the school will be finished.

Liberia update Praise God for his faithfulness. We just sent \$6,800 to finish the roof of our 6,000-square-foot church and ministry building. This building is located on 100 acres. This will be our second city of refuge. In the spring, we will be planting rubber trees, which have the potential to fund all of our missions.

IMI hits the 3.7 million meals mark through December 30th Thanks to God and his people, IMI has paid shipping on 330,000 meals to the Philippines each of the last ten months. To help out, mark **food** on your offering check. Through the generous giving of IMI partners, we were able to send a forty-foot container of food to the Philippines through our partner – Risen Savior Missions. Thanks for your support in feeding 6,000 children. We would like to be able to do this every month, if possible.

Construction projects in progress in 2014

- We are preparing a new room for storage at the Honduras orphanage.
- The walls around our Honduras medical clinic will soon be finished.
- We are building a gymnasium in the Philippines (25% done).
- We are building a school in Bangladesh (20% done) but paid for.
- A roof is being built on one of our churches in Liberia. Half of the roof is finished. And, it is paid for.
