WISDOM FROM THE *Word* FULFILLING YOUR DESTINY – PART TWENTY

"When the times will have reached their fulfillment" Ephesians 1:10

Just as an early delivery in a pregnancy can be detrimental to a child's health, so can our impatience thwart or hamper our destiny. A perfect example is Abraham who wanted a son. He and his wife decided he should have a child with a second wife, Hagar. That didn't go over so well with Sarah, and she told Abraham to divorce Hagar and send her away with Ishmael. The Bible says Ishmael would be like a wild donkey. And of course, we know that he is the Father of the Muslims that have been causing destruction in this world ever since. If Abraham only would have waited, we wouldn't have to be bombed and persecuted by these wild donkeys. There is a three-part danger I want to warn you about.

1. People usually associate wrong timing with "running ahead of God" which I think is crazy. How can a human run ahead of God when He is Alpha and Omega? God was at the finish line before we got started. The only way I can run ahead of God is when my character isn't ready, others aren't ready, or I am misinterpreting what I am supposed to do. Personally, I think I am so far behind God's plan that, by His grace, I will be able to accomplish only one-millionth of what I am supposed to do. After Pentecost, we weren't instructed to wait, but to go. While we wait, billions of people are going to hell, and hundreds of millions of children are going hungry. I believe it's time to get off our waiting program and get on our doing program. (A ninety-year-old man asked a hundred-year-old man, "How do you get to be a hundred years old?" He replied, "You just have to wait.")
2. God says He won't give us any more than we can handle. Oftentimes, the time isn't ready because we don't have our "ducks in a row". For example:
(a) We don't have our systems in place to be able to handle the pressure of the task and we will be quickly overwhelmed.
(b) We don't have the team players in place to be able to handle the mountainous calling that he has placed on us.
(c) We don't have the finances and/or resources to accomplish the task at

hand. (d) We don't have the wisdom and knowledge needed to fulfill our destiny. (e) We are not spiritually ready and the disciplines of prayer, praise, reading the Word, church attendance and fellowship are weak. (f) Our family is not ready. (g) The groundwork is not laid properly. (h) We are not able to handle the adversity and/or blessings that come with the calling. (i) We don't have the proper tools at hand.

3. The circumstances are not right, but God is showing you what you can expect and is calling us to prepare ourselves so that when the time comes, we need to run with all our might. For example, He told us to wait until we receive the Holy Spirit and then go into all the world and preach the gospel. The disciples spent time with Jesus, with each other praying and seeking God in the upper room – and then, bang, they were filled with the Holy Spirit and they went to the nations.

For example, God told me, "Agriculture changes culture" and that I cannot depend forever on traditional fundraising in a county that is inept at balancing the budget. Therefore, get involved in agriculture. So my friends, the Jampas from Chicago, bought and planted a hundred fruit trees and bought five sheep. The results were that almost every fruit tree died and the sheep ate the trees that did survive. Was it God's will to do agriculture? Yes, but the timing wasn't right. See point two above, for example. (a) Systems – now we have a farmer, helpers, wisdom, and a plan. (b) Team players – we have Oscar, who grew up on a farm in Honduras, running our farm with teen orphans to help and an engineer on staff. (c) Investment – we invested in plowing the land, an irrigation system, a tractor, fertilizer, plants, and good fencing. (d) Knowledge and wisdom – we have guidance from an engineer and an experienced farmer. (e) Spiritual – we have intercessors praying for us. (f) Family – my wife oversees the farm. (g) Groundwork – we spent \$10,000 cutting the trees and leveling the land, so we could plant. (h) Adversity happens – crops and animals die, machines break, missionaries quit, yet we keep going. (i) Tools – we have a tractor, irrigation system, water tanks and fencing.

Honduras Highlights

Report by Teresa Stamman Spending time with the children is great. We have long talks with them about life and God. The girls are the most excited about spending time together. We go for walks and talk about life or anything they like to talk about. We go shopping and have some ice cream with them. I take them in groups of six or ten so we can enjoy more time together. When we went shopping with the teenagers the other day, they didn't ask for anything, just for books to read. I bought them some Christian books and self-improvement books. They are eager to know about life. Adriana is at the orphanage on spring break. We had quality time together.

The children's English is improving so well. They write nice letters in English. They are going to start writing letters and having pictures for their sponsors. They are all excited about celebrating Mother's Day. We made baskets for the nannies and the poor mothers of the church.

We hired a new lady for the afternoons and weekends who is in charge of helping the children with homework, playing games and keeping them busy. She is doing a good job.

Building – We are building a new gate for the orphanage. It will look really nice. • The girls orphanage is going up. They are working on the walls. Next week, they will be working on the roof. It is very exciting to see it coming together. • The bids for the school bathrooms are coming. We will start building in two weeks or less. • We had contractors bid on the farm shed project. They will start next week. • The hotel is almost done. They are working on tile, sidewalks, doors and windows. This week, they will be painting the walls. It is looking beautiful.

Farm – Oscar is getting the soil ready for planting corn and also fruit trees. All will be irrigated with the phase one of the irrigation system. • We are starting to clean up the land on the other side of the road so we can plant grass for the cattle, sheep and goats. • We have ten sheep and two are pregnant. The children like to go and feed them. • The tilapia pond is ready to go. Oscar is buying fish.

Major news The retail center is near completion and will be finished by the time you receive this newsletter. This has been a three-year project. This 9,000-square-foot project is the largest building we have ever built. It includes three stores, one restaurant, offices, ten hotel rooms and a lobby. We praise God for the completion of this building. Currently, Teresa is buying air conditioners, beds, bedding, towels, furniture and decorations – and loving it.

Special thanks to Caruth Construction for donating for our buildings; Maribelle and Carl for building a room in the orphanage; Kevin and Julie Gustafson and Barb C. for donating a room in the orphanage; Brian Johnson who gave money in memory of his wonderful mom, Amy Viola Johnson; all of the churches and people who gave to our projects and kids; and so many others.

We need helpers Our building project is slowly moving forward and we are now taping and mudding the sheetrock. We are in need of ceramic tile layers, carpet layers, carpenters to put in doors and do finish work, a plumber to set bathroom fixtures, and asphalt people to extend the parking lot. Please consider coming on a mission trip with us.

Current building projects

- New gate for the compound.
- Electrical is currently being wired in the medical clinic.
- Girls orphanage will be completed in June. Walls are finished!

Projects paid for and getting ready to be built

- Barn for our tractor and implements.
- Four bathrooms for the school. The bathrooms in the orphanage are too far away and when the children cannot make it in time, they soil their clothes.

We are raising money for these City of Refuge projects

- Building a gas station.
- Remodeling the old girls orphanage into ten hotel rooms.
- Storage building for clothes, toys and supplies.

IMI is making five offers on five properties

- 1) Forty acres across the river with a three-bedroom house for \$150,000
 - 2) 65 acres on the river for \$120,000 which adjoins our property
 - 3) A house with one acre a mile down the road for \$60,000
 - 4) An operating four-acre fruit farm one-half mile down the road for \$40,000
 - 5) Fully irrigated thirty acres adjoining our property for \$250,000
- We are making bids on all five properties. We will buy the first one that takes our bid. There are two main things we are looking for: One, a place for our children under five to live. Two, we definitely need more farmland. Please pray for wisdom and direction.

Agriculture in process

- We are building a barn and have raised all of the money. When Rudolfo is finished with the electrical, he will finish the barn for the tractor, implements and grain.
- Phase two of the irrigation is paid for and Oscar is getting it ready in May.
- The corn will be planted in May.
- We are clearing the upper seventy acres to plant grass for the sheep, cows and goats.
- Our dear friend, Miss Kuriger, has donated enough money to buy six goats.
- We got our sheep back and they are grazing on the land.
- We bought 75 fruit trees which we will plant in May. This brings our total to 400 trees that are irrigated and will produce fruit.



Agriculture 2014 accomplishments

- We finished the fencing around the entire ninety acres.
- Oscar built three pens for calves, cows and sheep.
- Phase one of the irrigation is completed. We are watering over 300 fruit trees and the side of a hill for pasture.
- Oscar is milking two of the cows, so our babies get fresh milk each day.
- Some of our papaya trees are now producing fruit.
- We built a water storage tank for the irrigation system.
- We fixed our tilapia pond.
- We purchased 2,000 minnows to start our tilapia ponds which will provide meat for the orphanage and our restaurant.

Future agricultural needs

Pigs and pig pens • clearing seventy acres of virgin land to plant fruit trees • another tilapia pond • rabbits and pen • more cows • clear more land for fruit trees and also watermelons • chickens and chicken fencing • turkeys and pens.

Seven years ago when we opened up our first orphanage, Adriana and her sisters came to live with us. After staying with us for a short time, their grandma convinced Adriana's sisters to come back to live with her. And she put them into prostitution. Adriana chose to live with us. She is a wonderful Christian lady who walks with God. She goes to school full-time, has excellent grades and works as a nanny for some of the children. Her dream is to be a medical doctor. Construction projects in progress

Honduras – The roof is finished on the medical clinic and the rest will be done by June. • The barn for the tractor, implements and grain is under construction. • The walls for the girls orphanage are up and they are beginning work on the roof.

Liberia – The orphanage is one-third done and we sent \$8,000 to take it to the next level. • The church has the walls and roof up and the next stage is doors and windows.

Bangladesh – The walls of the school are being put up.

The Philippines – The gymnasium is 25% done.

Update for Liberia In the first week of May, we sent another \$8,000 to Liberia to build the girls orphanage. 32 girls will be able to live in this beautiful brand-new facility. We only need \$7,000 to complete the project. Please mark **Liberia** on your offering check. Thanks.

The City of Refuge (100 acres with buildings in Bomi) is being established. Five acres of land have been cleared and we need \$1000 to plant 242 rubber trees before the rainy season starts in May. That includes the trees, fertilizer and labor. The roof is finished on the church auditorium and school building and the future orphanage is on site now. We still need \$8,058 to complete the project, which includes doors, locks, windows, concrete repair and paint. Things are moving fast; IMI is making a huge **IMPACT** throughout the country.

Interest rates on all forms of saving and deposit accounts are very low. In many instances, the rate paid is below 1%. So should a person save money? On April 24, 2014, we had an unbelievable meeting in Polo, IL. It was powerful – in fact, of the fifty times I have been in this area, it was the most well-attended service ever. When the meeting was over a lady backed into my Hertz Rent-a-Car. (*No one was hertz!*) The police came to do a report. A short time later, I was asked to step outside in the cold rain. The police officer said to me, "Put your hands behind your back; I am going to handcuff you!" I thought he was joking as I have had lots of fun in the past with my sheriff friends driving a squad car, shooting guns and getting my car taped. I thought he was joking. He wasn't. He put me in the back of his car and showed me that Hertz had sent out a notice that my rental car was stolen. As the police officer checked my paperwork, we realized there was a major mistake. You see, back in January, I hit a sheep (It was a *baaad* experience). When I turned in the car at Hertz in the Minneapolis airport, I remember that the paperwork was totally messed up. I thought they fixed it, but they didn't.

This was the first time I have ever been fingerprinted in my life. It was an awkward experience knowing I was a slave in the Ogle County Jail. I was given a beautifully colored orange suit complete with flip-flops. I was put in a holding tank with a young man who had saints tattooed on one arm and devils on the other. I prayed the saint's personality would show up. I was there for six hours, and I got a chance to prophesy over him. He told me, "You freak me out and you scare me." Thirty minutes later, he received Jesus. I was put in cell block H which stands for "hell". I was with eleven other guys, including my new brother in Christ.

The first question they asked me was if I was in there for domestic abuse. I said, "No, they accused me of stealing a car." I felt awkward defending myself. But I felt I needed to because

when they found out I was a preacher, I didn't want them to think that I was a pedophile. I decided to payback the devil and start prophesying over people. One by one, God nailed nine of the eleven inmates. One was sleeping and the other declined. I found out later that I had prophesied over the one who declined many times in the past. I can only imagine what he thought of the prophet that was now a cellmate. All of the prisoners were afraid and told me that I freaked them out. Then the long wait began as I called my son to explain what happened. He started calling and talking to Hertz employees. The first 24 punted the ball down the field. He intermingled these calls with talking to the district attorney, chief of police and county employees. I didn't sleep for the whole night because of the bright lights, guys walking around, toilets flushing, guards banging doors, and a thin mattress on metal with no pillow. I began to read Psalms 1 through 10. And I was greatly inspired by all of the scriptures on justice and God crushing His enemies. Faith began to rise up in me and I prayed fervently with all of my heart, knowing that tens of thousands of kids were dependent on me.

I told my son to look for a man from Liberia who I met at Hertz. When my son mentioned that we have an orphanage, school and churches in Liberia, the man exclaimed, "Oops! We made a mistake." Then things began to unravel. Hertz called the county, district attorney, and chief of police to admit they made a mistake. My son "smelled blood" and threatened to sue the county for violating the sixth amendment. Two hours later, I was free. My son talked to Hertz and threatened them with a civil lawsuit. At that point, they settled for fifteen months of free rental for their mistake. This was a \$11,000 benefit. Results: One saved, ten witnessed to, \$11,000 of free car rental. Devil you lost! And my God won.

Exercise program for boosting your brain

Continuation of a series by Dr Teresa Stamman

Phase 1 This preliminary phase of basic stretching and warm-up shouldn't last longer than a week. Start by doing basic stretches that will help unlock tight muscles and joints. Work up to walking for fifteen continuous minutes every day. Make sure all your stretching is pain free.

If you do feel pain, stop immediately, then start again using less pressure.

Phase 2 Move to a dynamic combination of stretches that induce blood flow and get your heart pumping. Yoga, Pilates and low-intensity aerobic movements offer complex sequences of individual positions to transition you toward more vigorous exercise.

Phase 3 This phase involves aerobics/cardiovascular training that requires rhythm and synchrony of the whole body in various actions. Running, speedwalking, swimming, basketball and tennis are all good choices as well as any other activity you like to participate in. Dancing is a great phase 3 activity, especially if you do not like traditional exercise.

Phase 4 Next is weight lifting/resistance training to strengthen muscles and bones. Resistance training also offers the opportunity to break bad habits like bad posture that have persisted for decades and that might cause injury. Specific guidelines that promote injury-free exercise can be found in a variety of resources including specialized books and websites.

Phase 5 Cross-training combines phase 3 cardio and phase 4 resistance to enhance hormone balance, break down scar tissue and strengthen connective muscular tissue. It is the highest level of exercise for peak performance. Cross-training programs that combine the two regimens help you achieve this goal while keeping your brain and body sharp.
