WISDOM FROM THE *Word*

FULFILLING YOUR DESTINY – PART SEVENTEEN

“That he lavished on us with all wisdom and understanding.” Ephesians 1:8

God commands us to *“Not be unwise, but understand...the will of the Lord.”* Even though God's will for us is a mystery, yet according to this scripture, He gives us wisdom and understanding to know His will. Simply put, it is not impossible to know His will. God would never command us to know His will, if we could never know it. Therefore, you need to discover God's will for your life. Once you understand His will, you become almost unstoppable because you know if God is for you, no one can be against you. When you know God's will your faith is strengthened and multiplied. What is a mountain to someone else is a gopher mound to you. I can remember, for much of my life, stressing out about trying to make \$3,000 a month to feed my family. Now, I need to make \$3,000 a day. Do you know I had more stress trying to make \$3,000 a month than I do now needing to make \$3,000 a day to feed 10,000 children? Do you know why? Because I have been commanded by God – like the ravens – to feed God's people.

You become supernaturally charged and empowered, like Samson who struck down a thousand Philistines with a jawbone of a donkey. People constantly tell me that I work too much, but if I get my nap in, I am supernaturally energized. I don't need coffee or caffeine. I have vision and purpose. I know God's will for me, and I am not wavering by the grace of God. Every day I wake up emotionally maxed, because I know I am finally running the race to win. So many people run in circles or aimlessly, but when you know God's will, you can become focused and are not blown off course by circumstances or temptations.

Knowing God's will gives you a supernatural peace, so full of purpose that every day you walk in fulfillment, joy, and confidence. You are not wasting time with unfruitful and unproductive activities that waste time. Even if I temporarily do something that I enjoy, like fishing for an hour at one of our retreat places, I am with a person encouraging them, or I get up early before a meeting to enjoy God's creation. Without a purpose, we are no better than the wild beasts.

Honduras Highlights

Report from Teresa Stamman – seven more at the orphanage



Two boys are orphans because their mother was killed while trying to illegally enter the U.S. Their names are Carlos Abraham Orellana Rodriguez, 7 years old, and his brother, Josue Francisco Orellana Rodriguez, 7 years old.

Angie Minely Argueta Mejia, 14, Tony Fabricio Argueta Mejia, 12, and Jefferson Enrique Argueta, 8, came to the orphanage because they were living on the streets. They would sleep in different homes, wherever people would let them stay. Angie and Tony's father used to work in the market selling vegetables, but was killed last year. So Tony worked at the market in the morning to provide for his younger siblings and would go to school in the afternoon. Angie would work with her 55-year-old mother washing clothes for people to help bring food to the table for her four younger siblings. Jefferson is the youngest of these three and is a nephew of Tony and Angie's. His mother abandoned him when he was a baby because he was an obstacle to her life as a prostitute. His grandmother raised him with Tony and Angie. Tony and Angie's mother is now attending the IMI church.



Andy Antonio Zavala Rios, 8, and Jonathon Alexander Zavala Rios, 7, were brought to the orphanage by their mother because they are extremely poor. She works cleaning bathrooms and washing clothes, but only makes \$2 a day. She was unable to provide for her children and came to church crying and asking if we could take care of them. She knew they would have food every day, be able to attend school for the first time and have a better future. Andy and Jonathon are happy in their new home.



Honduras mission building projects

IMI school – The school is totally finished. We have ten students from the community who are attending. We now have school from grades K thru 7. Our goal is to add a grade each year. We bought new desks for the students, and their classrooms are beautiful. The kids love their new school. It is the most beautiful building in the area. Praise God for all of the IMI givers.

New construction: tool storage room is completed – We just finished the tool storage room which frees up a room for our girls to live. This will enable us to keep our tools organized and help to prevent them from "walking away".

IMI retail center – The outside walls are nearly done and so are the inside walls. We just sent another \$25,000 for the next phase. We plan to have the three stores and restaurant and motel rooms done by June.

Hotel – The walls are going up. They are working on the septic tank and the interior of the hotel.

Medical clinic – \$50,000 security walls and razor wire are done and paid for.

Fencing – Next week, we start fencing in the rest of the property.

IMI missionary report Jim and Lynn continue to do a bang-up job. We thank God for their faithfulness. The previous weeks, it was very busy at the orphanage. We had three missionaries from the states – David, Juan and Joseph. They worked on all sorts of projects around the orphanage. They finished building tables for the dining room, set up shelves in the classrooms to get the school ready, and also took care of some plumbing emergencies. Thank you, God, they were here!

Cattle gift from 1st Assembly of God in Rochester, MN

I used to attend First Assembly of God in Rochester, MN after I gave my life to Jesus in 1978. We are so blessed that they gave us enough money to buy five cows for our farm in Honduras. And they will be buying five more in the summer.

Agriculture We have great news! Oscar is harvesting all the corn and beans. We will have enough beans and corn for this year, plus we are selling some corn. Also, we started the first phase of the irrigation project. Oscar is buying all the materials to set up the whole system at a cost of \$12,394. As soon as that is finished, we will be planting thousands of fruit trees. And then, we will be investing another \$6,000 to finish the second phase of our irrigation system.

IMI hires a full-time engineer to build all of our buildings

Ana has been working with my wife for six months designing and engineering our buildings. We are getting many requests to build a home in the City of Refuge. Now, praise God, we are able to have someone on staff to help people build their homes full-time.

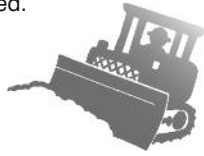

Important development for the City of Refuge

We have just finished *Phase Two* on our road, which now winds around the first high hill and into the interior of the land. Instead of walking up a steep and treacherous high hill, we can now drive up it. It is stunningly beautiful. We are surrounded by mountains. We will continue to build more roads into the interior and are beginning to develop our lots. The most beautiful sites will go fast. In the next year, we will begin to put layers of filling on top of the clay. Then, we will cover that with a hard surface, i.e., cement, cobblestone or asphalt. We sent \$10,000 to get *Phase One and Two* done. This will open up more agriculture and will be where people can build their homes in the City of Refuge. This is also where an apartment building for our workers and grown-up orphans will be located.

Why build in the City of Refuge?

- As of now, no property taxes
- Live with other committed Christians
- Tropical environment with no mosquitoes
- Gated community
- Love on the orphans, help out at a church, spend time loving God's people
- Have fun – there's soccer, fishing, hunting, shooting, games, fellowship, playing with the kids, ATV riding, hiking and golfing (fifteen minutes from a golf course)
- It's in the mountains, close to the beach, three hours from both coasts and has the second most beautiful coral reef in the world
- \$30 a square foot – built with cement and tile
- Honduras has no drones, no speed cameras and it is very libertarian – the freedom is so refreshing
- Start a business with almost no regulations and taxes
- No snow or icy roads
- Opportunities to love others
- Live in the country and in the mountains
- Become self-sufficient

Be a world changer “*I don't measure a man's success by how high he climbs but how high he bounces when he hits bottom.*” – *George S. Patton* If you are on the bottom of a swimming pool, stand up, especially if it is a baby pool. We all hit bottom, but God's people rise up. When somebody throws you a shovel, let it sink to the bottom, but you swim to the top. Whenever I feel discouraged, I've seen that a miracle is just around the corner.

Tom's quote “*The best way to get off the bottom is to get off your bottom.*” I can't believe in magic, nor do I expect God to do for me what I can do for myself. He has given us all authority, wisdom, understanding and the ability to create wealth; therefore, if I fail, it is my choice and mine alone. I refuse to be lazy, I refuse to make excuses, I refuse to be irresponsible; through God, I shall do valiantly. Get off your...and git'r done.

Success tip I love “little” thinkers; I will listen politely to them, but I refuse to do what they do. When I listen to them and their excuses, I am inspired to be better than that, with the help of Almighty God. Jesus said, “*Hearken to what you hear.*” Our ears are an open door for good or bad. Put guards on your ears, because what goes into your ears will eventually infiltrate your very being.

Prophetic word from Rev. Claudia Dobbins in Kailua-Kona, HI –

It's on my heart to put a challenge out to all the ordained ministers through IMI. I was thinking about the orphans today and about how we, as ministers, can give back to IMI. I saw on the website that IMI has ordained over 580 people through the ministry. I am one of them. The ones I have met have been wonderful. I was also looking at the faces of the four new children rescued in Honduras this past week. Without IMI, their lives were hopeless. Today, they need sponsorship. I was praying for a plan that could not only help these kids, but the many others who need consistent monthly sponsorship. IMI has had the desire to make their orphanages self-funding so the ministry can continue to build more small cities and rescue more kids. They are working hard to develop businesses within each community which will bring in repetitive monthly funds to help the kids and to build much needed medical centers. That is a great idea!

But what if we, as ministers, went one step further? Did you know that with over 580 ministers, if each of us sponsored two children, that would cover over 1,160 children a month with food and provision? That is \$60 a month for each of us.

This would greatly free up incoming funds for IMI to focus on building more orphanages. What if we took it a step further, and those of us who have churches or receive offerings took one offering a month specifically for the building, farming and medical facility needs of IMI? Or, what if we just gave a special offering to these funds once a month from our own personal funds? One person may not make a large dent in the need, but collectively, we could make a difference. I personally do not have a church or a ministry yet. I am a missionary recovering from cancer. But the Lord moved on my heart today to sponsor two kids to get the ball rolling, and I will find a way to do some kind of fund raiser or something extra to send the money. I am sure many of you give generously to IMI. You are heroes for Jesus, and honestly, in my heart too. Those who haven't jumped in on this in the past, like me, would you consider joining this challenge? Even sponsoring one child would make a big difference. Yesterday doesn't matter; today does.

Thank you for taking time to listen. I've prayed for a way to help Tom and Teresa to be freed up a bit to focus more on the greater work. We can help as ministers to support them in return for their unconditional love and support for us and make a difference to some kids in need. God bless you.

Report from our IMI partners in Thailand One hundred degrees difference in temperature! From -20°F in Minnesota to over 80°F in Thailand, our partners were there and back again in January. IMI minister Doug Nelson, along with his wife Jill, led a team of seven over to the building of Indo-China Mission Training Center in MaeSai, Thailand. This project, lying near the cusp of the Golden Triangle (where Burma, Laos, and Thailand meet), will provide a place of safety, rest, and training for countless indigenous ministers in the surrounding countries, including many under repressive regimes. The team assisted in implementation of the water system, laying cement foundations under water tanks and a second building, and ministering at several churches, including a remote mountain church. Pray for Doug and Jill as they wrap up their affairs in the U.S. and prepare to return to Thailand this fall for a five-month stint that will uniquely combine manual labor and ministry.

Construction projects in progress

- The walls are being put up on the school in Bangladesh.
- We are finishing the rest of the roof on our church and school in Liberia.
- Outside and inside walls are being put up in our Honduras retail center.
- Irrigation system is being installed at our farm in Honduras.
- We are building a gymnasium in the Philippines. (25% done)
- We are finishing the medical clinic in Honduras.



Big news in Liberia Pastor Steve rejoices and shares with me that we have been given another church and property with a congregation. "Give, and it shall be given to you."

Update from Liberia The second part of the roof in Bomi is being put on as you read this. This project will complete the roof on the total building. The building still needs windows and paint. Within the next two months, a pastor will be in place, so a church and feeding center will start. The future will include a school and orphanage. The congregation will oversee the planting and caretaking of the rubber tree plantation. They will be clearing five acres to plant the first crop of rubber trees. The cost for rubber trees and fertilizer will be \$500, plus, the initial labor of clearing and planting will cost \$500.

Capitoland supplied the finances for the bricks and labor for the orphanage in Monrovia to build an oven to bake bread to sell it to the community. This provides money for food and school supplies. Pastor Steve will be in Liberia in February to get bids to build a girls dorm for the orphanage, with a boys dorm to come after.

The IMI school in Liberia with over 100 students thanks Tom and IMI partners for the 100 desks and the windows and doors that were completed last month. They do want uniforms for their football (soccer) team. It is not requested, but all the school buildings need to be painted.

Another piece of property has been given to IMI, which includes a church building with an active group of people.

IMI hits the 4.3 million meals mark through February 28th Thanks to God and his people, IMI has paid shipping on 330,000 meals to the Philippines each of the last thirteen months. To help out, mark **food** on your offering check. Through the generous giving of IMI partners, we were able to send a forty-foot container of food to the Philippines through our partner – Risen Savior Missions. Thanks for your support in feeding 6,000 children.



The Joshua Project is about to begin

We read in the Book of Joshua, chapter 1: **1** Now therefore, arise, go over this Jordan, you and all this people, to the land which I am giving to them—the children of Israel. **3** Every place that the sole of your foot will tread upon I have given you, as I said to Moses. **5** No man shall be able to stand before you all the days of your life; as I was with Moses, so I will be with you. I will not leave you nor forsake you. **6** Be strong and of good courage, for to this people you shall divide as an inheritance the land which I swore to their fathers to give them. **10** Then Joshua commanded the officers of the people, saying, **11** "Prepare provisions for yourselves, for within three days you will cross over this Jordan, to go in to possess the land which the Lord your God is giving you to possess."

I've heard this scripture many times, and it always bears witness in my spirit. God is calling us to take the land and to redeem it for His purpose and His glory! I still remember traveling to Uganda on my first overseas missions trip with Tom in 2007. It was amazing how God had prepared the way before us and allowed IMI to purchase 100 acres of land within two days of arriving! Much of the land around the world is lying fallow and just a waste. As Kingdom ministers, we can take the land and use it to grow food, feed the poor, house the orphans and widows, and build a city on a hill that will shine the Light of Christ to the lost!

While the experience in Africa was an amazing one, I realized that we can't all travel to every country and buy land like Tom does. However, I believe God's command and calling to all of us is the same – to take the land, to receive our inheritance! I believe there are others who feel the calling to be a Joshua, but maybe don't have the time or resources to travel. For this reason, we would like to start a "Joshua Fund", to prepare provisions ahead of time, for the sole purpose of purchasing land in other nations. We don't know when that opportunity will present itself again for IMI, but we want to be ready when it does. I would like to challenge the Joshuas out there to join together to take the land for Jesus! **POSSESS** the land which the Lord your God is giving you! – *Isaac*

We are getting ready to buy land in Belize, and are currently looking at buying land in Honduras and Sierra Leone. You can either make a donation or buy the land. If you want to buy land with us and be a partner, mark it **Joshua Project**. Based on the amount you put in, you will be part owner of the land. In Belize, the land is about \$3,000 per acre. For example, if we buy land in Honduras and it costs \$50,000 with another \$50,000 to build infrastructure or buildings or to prepare land for farming, and you invest \$1,000, then you are one-percent owner of the land. Currently, IMI owns 850 acres, and someone from Liberia just gave us more land. Come and be a part of the Joshua Project – if you have questions, call me at **(612)202-6064**.

How To Communicate for Better Intimacy in Your Relationships Bring up things at a time that is good for both of you. Ask your partner if it's a good time, and if not, then negotiate a better time you can both agree upon to discuss your relationship.

Keep the issue on track. It's easy to begin communicating a laundry list of things all at one time, but this will be overwhelming to your partner. Try not to go off on tangents, and keep it to one or two simple statements at a time. Start sentences with "I feel..." or "I need...", instead of starting sentences with "You..." Stay away from absolutes like "You always..." or "You never..."
