# Honduras Highlights

**Report from Teresa** The children are doing very well and studying hard. The kids are very excited to go to their physical education classes with their uniforms. We have the very spacious school classrooms ready to be used. We will have another teacher come part-time in the afternoons to help the kids with studying, learning sports, and having Bible classes.

It is exciting to see our kids progressing in every area of life. The babies also are progressing. They are learning more songs in English. Sarah is doing a great job keeping the children busy with activities in the playroom and with swimming. We gave bikes to the best workers and best behaved. Next time, we will give bikes to the ones that pick up more trash. They are keeping their place very nice.

The kids are helping on the farm. They love the farm. We have ten new baby pigs that are three weeks old. They are very healthy and cute. For now, they are eating baby food and milk from mama pig. Our farmer, Luther, had a campaign of deworming and giving vitamin treatment to all the farm animals. The good news is that the hens are laying more eggs, the cows are giving more milk, the sheep and goats look much better, and the pigs look very healthy. Luther is ready to plant beans and corn to take advantage of the rainy season.

We are blessed to have missionaries come. They help a lot in activities with the children and building things. We appreciate them very much for coming. We have awesome missionaries from Missouri and Texas helping build rabbit cages. Thank you, Jesus, for that. We had the privilege to have Tom Caruth with his sister, Lory, and his daughter, Kelsey. They were a huge blessing to us and the children. We also had Pastor Toby from Texas ministering the baptism of the Holy Spirit and water baptism in the pool. It was very powerful.

**IMI is making a difference** We were looking at three pieces of properties with a man who lives in a town next to us. As we were bidding on the property and explaining what we do, he shared with us his gratefulness by telling us how appreciative he was that we were helping children and hiring people. Our goal of our city impacting other cities is becoming a reality.

**June mission teams** We had several groups of people come to the City of Refuge in Honduras in June. At the end of May and first part of June, we had Tom Caruth and his daughter and Tom's sister, Lori, from Ames, Iowa. This is Tom's second trip in three months. They loved it and blessed the children with their love and support.

Group two were six people who came to the City of Refuge. Our friends, the Millers, came from Missouri. She is an agronomist and came to help us with our fruit trees. Her husband is a counsellor and their daughter is in college. They enjoyed ministering to the children.

We were also blessed to have Rev. Toby from the San Antonio, Texas area. He preached and God touched our children. He also brought Lance, his business friend who has an All-State agency and his son, Logan. This trip really impacted them. They built rabbit homes and Pastor Toby ministered to our children.

We had my good friends, Pastor Brian and his family, and members from the Assembly of God church in Lodi come June 6-18. This is their second trip in two years. They painted, built walls, made tables and chairs, and dug holes for trees. They also ministered to the children.

**Pastor Toby from Texas preached and 29 of our children were baptized** Pastor preached on the Holy Spirit and we prayed for the children. God moved on their hearts and 29 children were baptized in water. It is the most I have ever seen in my life. In fact, I don't think I have ever baptized this many people in my entire ministry.

**Two containers went out the first week of April** Both of our containers are still in the port in Honduras. We have learned a lot. Please pray they will be released.

**Loading dock** In preparation for our two containers, we had to build a loading dock. Praise the Lord! It is finished and ready to go.

**Incredible divinely orchestrated connection** I was talking on the phone at the Atlanta airport when a man walked up and overheard me say "pastor". We started talking and he said he was a pastor from San Antonio. Immediately, he mentioned he wanted me to come to his church. I began to prophesy about farming, television, starting churches, etc. He was rocked. I invited him to the City of Refuge. On Wednesday, my wife was going to go to the garbage dump with the missionaries, but she felt impressed to say, "I can't go, I have an appointment." Except, she didn't have one, but felt compelled in the Spirit to say that. Thirty minutes later, the guard says there is a pastor who wants to meet with her. It was Pastor Jose that I met in Atlanta. He brought a number of pastors with him. As my wife was giving him a tour, he shared that he wanted to quit the ministry and had prayed, "God, send someone to tell me not to." In my prophecy, I had said, "You can never quit." He was rocked, and he wants me to come to his church in San Antonio. I asked my wife how they knew how to find our place. A member of their church used to teach in our school. God is good!

**Multi-purpose building – it is finished!!!** Room #1 is our rec room so the kids don't wreck things. Our children love games, so we built them a rec room. As of June, we have two new foosball games, two ping pong tables, two new couches, fifty chairs, three tables, Lincoln logs, tinker toys, board games, a puzzle table and an art table. In June, I brought down legos, board games, Lincoln logs, little animals, hot wheel cars and tracks, etc. In July, we want to have an air hockey game. We would also like to have good Christian music to listen to. Room #2 is for storage. What a blessing to have enough space to store our donations! For the first time, we can get really organized. Hallelujah! Room #3 is the wrestling room/music room/classroom. Room #4 is the workout gym. The equipment is still in the port. Go God! Room #5 is our sewing room. We are waiting on sewing machines and cutting machines.

**IMI continues remodeling toddlers orphanage** We have raised the roof and finished installing the new roof. Currently, we have taken the plaster off the entire building and are beginning to replaster it. This month, we sent \$1,700 to put in new electricity for the entire orphanage. This project will total \$40,000. We will be putting in a new wall, bathrooms, hot water and a kitchen. Then we will replaster the walls, paint and add a nice concrete walled-in play area for little ones.

**IMI had a fire in our school** No one was hurt, praise God! We had to invest in a transformer as our system could not handle the power that we needed. It cost \$7,000 and it was one of those surprising negative things we had to deal with. The damage was only \$500.

**To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year** 100% of the monies goes to the school, ZERO to Tom and Teresa. You will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then you get the great opportunity to help a child change the world through bilingual Christian education.

# Honduras Highlights

## Sponsor a child to go to college

Currently, Adriana, our eldest daughter in the orphanage (whose mother and sisters are prostitutes), is in her second year of medical school. IMI is looking for seven sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$350 a month or one sponsor for \$700 a month. Life is getting more expensive there and schooling even more. Please pray about helping Adriana become a doctor. Mark **Adriana** on your check to help with her education.

## New school classrooms are finished!

We had to build two new classrooms because we ran out of space. Praise God and thanks to our generous donors, the building is done. The kids are jam-packed in the school. One of our classrooms had 35 kids crammed in, but now, they have ample room. Our mission team coming down in June are building more tables and chairs. These two rooms are by far the biggest classrooms that we have. Eventually, we will be building another two classrooms so we can have kindergarten through 11th grade.

**Music** Not Teresa's or my forte, yet we know the importance of music for worship and personal growth. A brother from Hibbing, MN blessed us with a trombone. I also brought down a flute and two violins and an amplifier. We also have two guitars and a keyboard. We are praying for a music teacher.

## New church/chapel being built at the City of Refuge

We just sent \$10,000 to build our church/chapel on the top of our little mountain. What a beautiful view to be able to see the City of Refuge as we worship God and learn His Word. The groundbreaking will be in June. They have already begun digging the foundation. Pray for many salvations and the power of God to come.

## We are breaking ground on our senior high boys orphanage

We have just sent \$5,000 to begin building our new boy's orphanage. It will have two uses. One, we will have six to eight boys in each of the two buildings. And two, it can be versatile and turned into two-bedroom apartments for our workers, widows or poor families from the garbage dumps. Mark *orphanage* if you want to help.

**Honduras government** came and planted hundreds of trees that are used for expensive wood for free. This is the first time we have ever blessed by a government.

## The roof is going on house #3

**Hallelujah!** It's way bigger than I imagined. It will also be able to be rented in the near future. Again, it will provide extra income for children and bless God's people.

**Juice bar is done** It's a beautiful juice bar that will provide another income stream for IMI. Our good friends, Tom and Lori Caruth and Tom's daughter, made hot dogs at our new juice bar near the pool and the kids loved it.

**Security is very important, especially in a third world nation** We have begun to finish the walls in the front of the building. It is very costly as we have to use iron bars so people can still see the stores. But the walls are beautiful and every month our place is getting more secure. We invest \$5,000 a month. I'm hoping that we could complete the project with two or maybe three more payments. We will also bring the wall about 100 meters up the side of our property which is about 1.3 miles from one end to the other.

Phase 1 was to put chain-link fence around the twenty acres where our orphanage and farm is. Phase 2 was to put barbed wire around the property, which we did last year. Phase 3 is to put four rows of cement blocks and eight feet of chain-link fence with razor wire on top around the seventy acres. Phase 4 is to redo walls around the orphanage with four rows of cement blocks and eight-foot chain-link fence topped with razor wire. Phase 5 is putting cement walls, 10-12 feet high and topped with razor wire, around the twenty acres where our orphanages are. Phase 6 is putting the same type of walls around the seventy acres where the new boys orphanage is going to be.

Currently, we are installing four layers of block in the ground and eight-foot high chain-link fence topped with razor wire around the entire ninety acres. It is an expensive and difficult task, but it is definitely needed to keep bad people out and the goats inside. In May and June we have invested \$5,000. Our goal is to invest \$5,000 a month.

## Finally bought a new farm pickup truck

Our old farm truck had a broken windshield, no air conditioning and kept breaking down. We sold it and were able to buy a nice replacement by taking out a loan against our house for \$7,000.

**Our pickup truck used to transport people from the airport** was breaking down so much it was costing \$1,000 a month in repairs, so we bought a second new pickup. It is a backup vehicle if our van is not working. It's a beaut, and it cuts down our driving time to the airport by 40%.

## Future projects

**Carport** – We need to build a carport to get our four trucks and van out of the rain and the sun. We have already picked out the location.

**Repair station for cars** – We want to hire a mechanic to work on cars. We have picked out the location and we would like to start building it by the end of the year.

**Farming news – IMI hires new agricultural engineer** Our farmer, Oscar, took another job with another company, and the next day, we hired Luther. Luther is an agricultural engineer and has received military training. We are happy to say that Luther has taken it to the next level. With his expertise, we are able to use 21st century techniques to get a greater harvest to feed more people. Also, Luther's dad was a colonel in the Honduras army and all of our guards are trained by his father. This gives us unbelievable connections in Honduras. We miss Oscar and are praying he will come back someday.

**IMI is buying rabbits** Our mission team during the first week are making rabbit hutches. Rabbits can give birth every two months. Think of the multiplication process – five females in two months yields fifty babies or 300 per year. If half the babies are female, you will have 25 females to breed in four months who will produce 250 more. By the end of a year, you have over 1,000 females to breed. It's incredible!

**IMI had baby pigs** In May, we had our first litter of piglets – ten of them, praise God! Even though I personally do not eat pork, my rationale is that pork is healthier than eating from the garbage dumps.

**IMI had a baby horse** Cute!!! What can I say?

## IMI is getting ready to build a cow barn

The money was donated by a wonderful lady from Wisconsin. We will break ground in June and hope to have it finished in July.

**Poultry** Our turkeys and chickens are laying eggs. We have seven turkeys, 120 chickens and three ducks. Currently, we are getting about twenty eggs per day. Our missionary, Sarah, takes the eggs to hatch them. She hatched her first chick when we were in Honduras.

**IMI chicken barn needs shade and electricity** The big chicken barn with a hundred houses for our laying hens is 1,500 square feet. Thanks to the missionaries and our givers, we were able to build it. When the layers start doing their job, we won't have to buy eggs for the children. Currently, we are buying 2,000 eggs a month. Our ag farmer, Luther, pointed out that the chicken barn was built in the wrong direction. So we have to plant banana trees (temporal solution) and orange trees (a permanent solution) to provide shade. Then we have to bring electricity in to provide light for ultimate egg production.

**Goat fencing** We have six strands of barbed wire for the fences, but those goats keep getting out. So now, we are going to put up chain-link fencing with razor wire on top for sixty acres. This will keep the goats in and the bad people out. Please pray, it costs about \$15,000.

**IMI is setting up five tilapia ponds**

Our ponds are dug and we are working on hooking up the pipelines to fill the tilapia ponds. We currently have five ponds, but our goal is to have twelve. Our goal is to be the number one producer of tilapia in Honduras. Plus, we will be planting fruit trees around and between the ponds. And then, we will let our ducks and geese swim and eat the vegetation. So we are getting triple use of the land. We have sent \$1800 to hook up the water. Three of the ponds are huge, and when they are in full operation, we won't have to buy fish anymore.

**Vegetables** Our vegetables are growing, and we are looking forward to our first harvest in the next month.

**Beans are in short supply in Honduras**

The government of Honduras guarantees a minimum price for beans because there are not enough beans being raised. Beans are more expensive to raise, but they produce a higher profit margin than corn. This growing season we are planting 10% beans and 90% corn. Each growing season, we are going to up the percentage of beans. Plus, we now have more farmland to raise beans and corn.

**IMI plants 200 fruit trees on our eight-acre property**

Fruit trees on our property have to be irrigated. We have planted 200 trees, and they are fully irrigated. Our next phase is to put up a chain-link fence with razor wire. Then, we'll build a chicken barn and buy chickens. Our last step is to build a house for a farmer to watch over it all. We currently have 1,775 fruit trees.

**IMI burnt the weeds and thorn bushes on 52 acres**

In the month of June, our engineer will be planning out the irrigation system. We will need to make sure that our grass will grow with no delays because of lack of water.

**IMI buys second irrigation system for 62-acre property**

We have just sent \$8,700 to plant corn and beans on our new property. This is the first time we will be able to use this property. After the planting, our engineer will be putting in the irrigation system. We are going to be quintupling our land for corn and beans. Our past goal was to have enough grains to feed our orphans and livestock. We are now entering phase two, which is to harvest the grain and give it away to feed 2,000 children and widows a month. The cost is \$23,500 and is a very large investment, but after only six months, we will be able to recoup our monies. Thank you, Jesus.

**We made our eleventh payment of \$6,000 for the 52 acres and a house** We have thirteen payments left to pay off this property. The cattle are enjoying 52 acres of food. If you would like to donate for the land, please mark **land** on your offering.

**People wonder why** we don't just do one project and finish it before going on to the next one. One of the major reasons is that we keep approximately fifty men working in construction. Honduras is different than America. In America, we give struggling people (and sometimes what appears to be undeserving people who don't want to work) free food, housing, telephones, health insurance, clothes and water. In Honduras, people (which includes undeserving people) die. By putting people to work, we provide an income with dignity. Instead of a handout, we provide a place for them to work with their hands. Over ninety families in Honduras alone make their living through IMI and over a hundred families worldwide. Thank you for helping us help the world.
