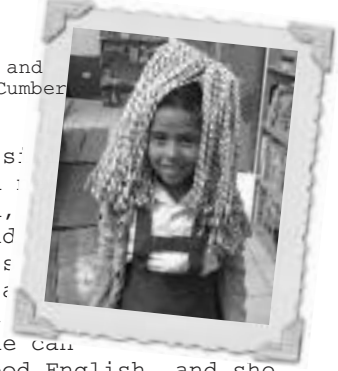
Marriage Tip by Teresa Stamman

WISDOM FROM THE *Word*
KING UZZIAH – PART SIXTEEN

"And broke down the walls of Gath..." 2 Chronicles 26:6

Currently, we are fighting a problem that is prevalent in life and even in the Bible. It's called projection. Projection is when a person has sin, issues or problems, and they incorrectly assume that others have the same problem. They begin to accuse people of things that they are actually doing. For example, when someone calls everybody a liar, it's because that person is a liar. When someone is always worried about their spouse being unfaithful, it can mean the worrier is the unfaithful one. Falsely accusing people is so evil that one of the ten commandments is, "Thou shalt not bear false witness."

I could give you numerous examples of people in my life, who have accused me of the very things that they are doing. These people are full of greed, anger, bitterness and deception.

Projection is more than a psychological disorder; it is a demonic, murderous deception. I am amazed how many people accuse people of the very things they do. We saw this in the scandals of the 1980's when evangelists were condemning other evangelists for doing the things they themselves were doing.

Projection causes people to want to destroy others, even in the name of God. They have a self-righteous, proud, evil spirit that is blinded to their own sin and seeks to destroy others who they assume have the same problem. Somehow they are able to do a gymnastic exercise that deflects personal blame and responsibility and turns their vain imaginations into evil actions that go full bore to destroy others. Jezebel, a Baal worshiper, accused a godly man of blaspheming God, when in fact, she was the one who blasphemed the God of Israel and killed prophets. Yet she was able to convince others that this godly man was evil. Her desire was to help her husband, King Ahab, steal a garden from him. The result was this godly man was falsely accused and put to death.

Jesus described this horrible condition as hypocrisy. Hypocrites are people who put on false fronts in order to deceive onlookers. Jesus accused the Pharisees of preaching about requirements that they themselves weren't doing. In fact, Jesus went a step further and said that the Pharisees laid heavy burdens on people, not even lifting a finger to help them. I love that in the military a commanding officer cannot ask his soldiers to do what he cannot do. We shouldn't expect people to do what we are unwilling to do. Paul issued a rebuke by asking those who preach, "Don't commit adultery" – "do you commit adultery?" The problem of projection is an ugly flaw in humanity. We must guard our hearts and ask God to protect us from hedonistic, greedy, lying finger pointers. Someone once said, "You can tell someone's sins by what they preach against the most."

Projection is a way to put the blame on someone else and deflect responsibility for one's own actions. This ultimately leads a person to hell. They are unable to repent and confess their sins because, by blaming others, they feel they have done no wrong. Currently, we are in a war with three people who are projecting their greed, lies and thievery on us. May the God of Justice wield the sword of righteousness, and may His power break down the walls of Gath!!!

MEMORIAL WEEKEND AT OUR CABIN IN WEST UNION, IOWA – MAY 27-28

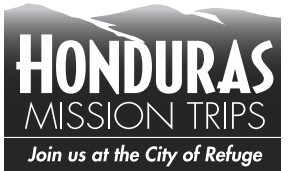

HONDURAS HIGHLIGHTS

Report from Teresa Last month, we hired a psychologist. He is fantastic. This month, we hired a social worker who is helping me reorganize the system of workers and children. We are establishing a good work team. I'm very excited because this will help us hire the right people and let go of the workers who are not adequate for the job. Social service is requiring us to have professional people taking care of the children. I totally agree with that. We have people that need jobs but they are not necessarily what we need. The process is going to be a little bit hard for everybody, including the children, but in the long run, it will be beneficial for all of us. This is going to free me to do my medical work that I was starting to do, PTL!!! We had five new children last month. They were happy with us until social services came and took them to their family. I guess they know what to do. Just pray for them. We are hoping they are doing okay.

We have Bible studies for our workers and children. We can see the need to have godly people surrounding the kids. One of our teachers is coming three times a week to work out in the gym with the children and play soccer with them. That is helping them to redirect their energy in the right direction. I also work out with the girls and have Bible studies at the gym. They look forward to that girl-time with me.

We had Laura Diehl with us this last month. She had awesome training for our teachers and personnel. They are still talking about it. We need her back! She and her husband, David, were teaching children to play trumpet and saxophone. We have very talented children. We also have an artist who is going to have art and sculpture classes for the children on the weekends. That is exciting!! Tonight we will take the children and workers to a revival meeting with Pastor Julio Zavala not very far from the City of Refuge. We are wanting to get in the fire of God. Time is short; what if we meet Jesus tomorrow? We need to be prepared!!

Major prayers needed Bad people have been causing havoc for us in Honduras. Pray for deliverance for us!!! It's our number one trial we are facing. The Bible says whoever digs a pit will himself fall into it. May it be so!!! We need serious prayers. We were told to hire a psychologist and a social worker to work with the children, which is a good thing. The children definitely need some healing. Of course, it's going to cost about \$1,200 to \$1,500 more a month in salaries. God provided through our awesome friends at Caruth Construction. They are giving enough money to cover about six or seven months. Hallelujah! Keep praying.

Dream comes true This month we were blessed to have the girls from another orphanage come and play in our pool and enjoy the soccer field. We anticipate doing this more and more. Jesus desired that our joy may be full. Seeing the children have so much fun squealing with joy gives me great joy. I hope and pray it erases some of their horrible memories from the past. I believe by giving children in opportunity to have fun in the realm of Christianity oftentimes will lay a foundation that serving Jesus is awesome.

New missionary Joshua Otte is in Honduras Joshua has been to Honduras many times and has been on many missionary trips in Africa and Europe. He will focus on working with all of the mission trips. This will free my wife to focus on the multitude of things she has to do. Joshua will also oversee our other missionaries. He will be helping missionaries with building projects as well as getting our children involved. And most importantly, he will be helping Teresa. We are so excited! Joshua has had a vision to be a full-time missionary for seven years. We thank Pastor Doug Holt for releasing him to us.

Missionaries for the month of April We were blessed to have a number of teams come to the City of Refuge. We had a team of five from Chicago come and bless the children with presents and take food to the garbage dumps. Our good friends and long-time supporters, Brian and Linda Linkoos from Ellijay, Georgia, came for five days to check out the City of Refuge. Rev. David and Rev. Laura Diehl also came to Honduras. It's Rev. Laura's second time, and she did a workshop for our teachers. Both of them cleaned and repaired our instruments and gave our children music lessons. Also, Rev. Eric and Rev. Hannah from my hometown in Rochester, Minnesota came to check out the City of Refuge.

New long-term missionaries have arrived
 • Brother Mike, from one of our churches in Waukesha, Wisconsin, booked a one-way ticket to Honduras. He hopes to stay for three months. His daily schedule will include two hours helping our farmers, two hours developing our garden of tomatoes and onions, one hour working on computers, one hour hanging with the kids and two hours picking up garbage.
 • Brad Wynn is the son of one our IMI ministers who pastors an IMI church in Rockford, Illinois. His first project is to get one of our fishing ponds going. Project two is to fix fifteen or twenty broken bikes, and then, he will work with our mechanic, Henri, to get our old van working again.

Music We brought one more instrument to Honduras, our first trombone. God is preparing us to start an orchestra to bless Him and win souls for Christ. Pray we find the right music teacher.

To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year 100% of the monies goes to the school and ZERO goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.

Sponsor a child to go to college Currently, Adriana, our eldest daughter in the orphanage (whose mother and sisters are prostitutes), is in her third year of medical school. Please pray about helping Adriana become a doctor. IMI is looking for seven sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$350 a month or one sponsor for \$700 a month. Mark **Adriana** on your check.

Volleyball court is almost finished As of April 25th, the cement floor is done and the poles are up. We need to paint the court and put up a chain-link fence to keep kids from hurting themselves. Then it's spike time! I love volleyball!!!! We thank God, Dr. Tim Peterson and CFC for donating half the money for the volleyball court.

IMI building projects
Boys orphanage – Navoth and his brothers are remodeling the boys bathrooms.
Pantry – Because of problems with rodents eating through our sheetrock, we are building a large pantry made out of cement block and metal. Find another home, Mickey and Minnie and your little buddies !!!
Laundry room – The girls laundry is huge. We are currently putting on a large roof to keep the clothes dry.
Pig barns – Omar and Torres are about ready to complete their building of the pig barns.

Well update We found a company who is going to dig all three of our wells. He is giving us a 12% discount to help out our orphanage.
In April, we sent money to plant one hundred fruit trees that are native to Honduras. They are so sweet! They bring \$2 a pound wholesale and are sold in China. We are also planting about five acres of corn in the area where we have just put in our new irrigation system.

Donations needed In April, I brought a trombone for the orchestra we want to start. We were blessed to have Rev. Laura and Rev. David Diehl clean the instruments and give lessons while they were in Honduras. Thanks to the generosity of God's people I brought clothes, yarn, toys, hygiene products, knee pads, and lots of paper and office supplies for the school. We could use *working instruments * art supplies * nice clothes from ages 2-17 * nice books in Spanish or English * tennis shoes * sporting goods * toys * tools. If it weighs more than fifty pounds we cannot use it. Guava tree farm We have a full-time farmer working with our guava trees. Currently, we have 11,000 guavas on our trees. The average price per guava is 50-70 cents. We are able to have a couple of harvests a year. This is a very profitable crop, and we have three more years of harvests before needing to replace the trees.

Tomatoes One of our missionaries from Wisconsin is in charge of growing tomatoes. There is nothing like fresh tomatoes. Yummy!
New babies born on the farm In April, the Lord added a baby horse, five new baby pigs and two goats to our farm.

Rabbits They are multiplying just as the Lord showed me.

We are harvesting 300 to 400 eggs a day - not EGGsaggering!!! We are no longer able to buy eggs. (We were buying a hundred a day.) Now, we are able to sell them. We've been able to drop the price of eggs in the community, plus make a profit. The community is happy.

We are building four chicken barns under one roof We have just paid for the watering system and doors for the new chicken facility. We will be buying 300 chicks every few weeks and harvesting a minimum of a hundred a week for the orphanage. We are projecting that in three months we will no longer have to buy chickens for the orphanage.

Ducks and free-range chickens were laying about 35 eggs a day. Now, we will no longer eat their eggs, but will allow them to hatch. The ducks and chickens will be able to multiply, thus, providing meat for the children. Our turkeys and ducks are doing great. Every morning I can hear the turkeys gobbling.

Bioidentical Hormone Therapy

Dehydroepiandrosterone (DHEA) in Women

DHEA is oftentimes referred to as the "mother of all hormones" because it fuels the hormone pathway - a term that refers to the body's delicate interplay of hormones. Women rely on adequate levels of DHEA to balance other key hormones throughout the body, such as estrogen, progesterone and testosterone. DHEA in women is produced by the adrenal glands. As women age, DHEA levels - like most hormones - begin to decline. However, age isn't the only culprit.

Have you ever heard of "the stress hormone" known as cortisol? Like DHEA, cortisol is produced by the adrenals, as also is adrenaline. These are two hormones that assist in the body's "fight or flight" response to stress. Although we rely on hormones like cortisol and adrenaline to help prepare the body for stressful situations, chronic stress can cause the adrenal glands to work overtime. While the adrenals are preoccupied with pumping out large quantities of cortisol and adrenaline, they can't produce enough DHEA.

Low levels of DHEA in women can cause symptoms which include fatigue, weight gain, depression, aching joints and low libido. On the other hand, adequate DHEA levels can help boost libido, rebuild muscle mass, reduce weight, improve memory, boost the immune system, promote flexibility and raise energy levels.

If you suspect that the symptoms you're experiencing may translate into a DHEA imbalance, hormone testing is available to determine where you stand hormonally. With the "mother load" of benefits associated with DHEA, it is definitely worth seeing your doctor to check your levels. As with any supplement, consult your doctor before taking DHEA. For women, a close eye should be kept on estrogen levels to ensure they do not go too high, an important key to help lower the risk of certain diseases, including breast, ovarian and other hormone-sensitive cancers.

Mama pigs are pregnant A year ago, we had three pigs. We have eaten nine and now have 41 pigs. After our pig barns are finished, we will be able to have 140 pigs. All we have left are the doors and the watering system and we'll be able to quadruple our pork production. With the exception of a Taiwanese school that trains Taiwanese in hog raising, we are already the biggest hog operation in the area.

Cattle We have five baby calves that are growing and healthy and we are expecting more to be born very soon. We save about \$1400 a month by producing our own milk.

Fish We now have approximately 7,000 tilapia. We currently harvest 150 fish every week, so we no longer have to buy fish. The lobsters are growing. We are one of only five farms in the nation to raise fresh water lobster.

The promise of God is being fulfilled As of April, we no longer have to buy eggs, milk, guavas, corn, pigs or fish. Each month, we knock out one type of food that we will no longer have to purchase. Fruit will take the longest as it takes three to five years before the trees produce.

Butcher shop One of our biggest needs is to build a butcher shop. Our missionaries that are in Honduras right now are designing it.

IMI in Honduras will need a salesman and a refrigerated truck Within the year, we will be hiring a salesman to go to grocery stores, restaurants, and markets to sell meats, fruit, beans, corn and vegetables. I imagine our salesman will have a laptop and will ask the vendors and owners if they want duck, turkey, beef, pork, chicken, eggs, tilapia, twelve types of fruit, and various vegetables. This will provide a job and more resources to bless people.

Belize here we come
We have had missionaries in Belize for many years, and we believe that God

has put on our hearts to build a City of Refuge in Belize. We are currently looking at properties in Belize. I have talked to my engineer in Honduras and our best contractor and they want to go and help us get it started. We are so excited!

Report from Sam and Becky Barber in Belize It's been a busy month between looking for properties for Tom and having a missions/ educational team staying with us for 2½ weeks. Tom has us looking for land here in Belize. We are so happy to do this. A team from Barclay College was with us from the 10th through the 27th. They helped us at the two sites where we work with at-risk kids and teens. Violence is up now that a major gang leader has been killed. All the kids seem to be on edge. Please pray for the kids and please pray for us. God provides great ministry for us. All the work we do here in Belize is voluntary. Would you like to partner with us? We need prayer and financial partners. Checks may be sent to IMI with **Barbers** in the memo line.

IMI has a new partner in Cameroon and Gabon, Africa Dr. Hughes is now Rev. Hughes. Dr. Hughes was officially approved in April. We are excited to work with him in the near future. Dr. Hughes just met with a number of ambassadors in Africa. He is already building his school. Teresa and I are believing to go to Africa the end of August and beginning of September to check out what he is doing with IMI.

We are redirecting our resources from feeding children and widows in Honduras to helping children and widows from other nations *Single moms* - We have contacted our partners in Liberia, Haiti, India, Guatemala, Philippines, and the Democratic Republic of Congo to see if they have single moms and widows who need our help. If people don't contact us, we will share the monies with poor women in other countries. We are excited Dr. Annie from DRC is getting us photos and bios of her hard working widows. *Any questions, please call me (Tom) at (612)202-6064.*

IMI has given nearly \$435,000 away this year in four months but we have a long way to go to fulfill God's calling on IMI to help Honduras and other nations.

Pray with me about future plans I am believing God that, starting in March of 2017, I will be going to Honduras twenty times a year for four days each time, and also, once to Africa, once to Europe, once to Asia, and once somewhere else around the world. In March of 2018, I want to increase the Honduras trips to five days instead of four.
