**Report from Teresa** In Honduras, they have a holiday called Lempira Day. Our kids celebrate that holiday in the school. The students dressed up as Indians, cooked Honduran food and had lots of fun. They chose a queen of the celebration and one of our girls, Vanessa, won as "Senorita lempira" for having the best Indian dress.

The seventh and eighth grade students moved to their new classrooms. So now we have a music room and an art room. We are collecting instruments for our music room. Antonio, one of our children who is very artistic, is using his great talent to draw beautiful pictures on the babies dorm walls. They look amazing!

We hired a new teacher to teach Bible stories, Christian songs and good manners to our three-year-olds. She is a good Christian lady who is very patient with the children. Susan and Scott McCumber are doing a great job teaching our kids art and music. Our babies are learning a lot of English Christian songs. It is so sweet to hear them singing. When I feel like it is hard and battles come our way, I just think about these little ones. This helps me refocus on my calling to help children.

We are equipping our rec room with more games. The kids love to go there and have fun. The kids are keeping up every day with picking up trash from the whole compound. They help feed our three-month-old pigs every day. Alex and Junior go every day at 5 a.m. to milk cows.

**July mission team** In the middle of the month, Pastor Kurt Verhoeven came for the third time this year and brought five people with him. They were involved in building chicken coops and evangelizing the neighborhoods. We are praying that one day Kurt and his wife will move to Honduras to work together with us.

**August mission teams** We have Deb Vleck and her two sons from Eau Claire, WI coming down for three weeks. Her boys are so excited to get involved in agriculture. Rev. Chris Voightlander from Greenville, WI will be coming with me at the end of the month. I will also be bringing Derick and Melinda Stirling to Honduras for the second time. Plus ??????????????

**Church at the top of the mountain is now finished** What a beautiful place to worship God! We are so excited to be able to look down at the City of Refuge and pray and worship the God who created the heavens and the earth.

**Good news!! We hired a part-time medical doctor for our clinic** We thank Dr. David and Karen Murdy for providing the doctor's pay. The clinic is open twice a week. In July, we saw 450 patients, PTL. We also had two weekends of medical crusades in the mountains where we saw close to 700 patients. We were so blessed to have medicine donated, so we are using it to bless a lot of people. Glory to God for that! These poor people have no way to pay for a doctor's visit, or even worse, to pay for medication. Thank you, Jesus, that we could help them.

**Sponsor a child to go to college** Currently, Adriana, our eldest daughter in the orphanage (whose mother and sisters are prostitutes), is in her second year of medical school. IMI is looking for seven sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$350 a month or one sponsor for \$700 a month. Life is getting more expensive there and schooling even more. Please pray about helping Adriana become a doctor. Mark **Adriana** on your check to help with her education.

**To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year** 100% of the monies goes to the school and ZERO goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.

**Junior** This little boy (dressed in his Lempira Day Indian costume) is ten years old. We got him when he was six months old. His parents were abusive so his grampa dropped him off at the orphanage. Junior is a loving child who is very smart and receives very good grades. He loves to help on the farm and gets up early every day to milk cows.

**City of Refuge now has souvenirs available for purchase** We have T-shirts and coffee mugs.

**Babies orphanage** The doors and windows of the babies orphanage will be finished mid-August. Then, we will finish the ceiling and begin putting in the new tile. Hopefully, by the middle of September, we will be able to finish the bathrooms and kitchens and the babies can move back into their new home.

**Painting buildings** Our teenagers are stenciling and drawing beautiful murals in the babies orphanage. I'm impressed!

**Our next remodeling project** The boys orphanage needs some TLC and the bathrooms need to be redone. With 36 boys, I'm sure you understand.

**Music prayer answered** Our new music teacher, who has been teaching in another school in Honduras, will be moving into the City of Refuge. Her name is Emily. I actually stayed in her parents' home back in 1987. Her dad was a wrestling captain on a team in our conference. We are so happy to add Emily to our staff team. It was so cool when Emily came to the City of Refuge and we found out that she went to school with my son Phil and my daughter Natasha.

**Music** Our goal is to buy an instrument a month. This month we purchased an acoustic guitar, another flute and another trumpet.

**Future project - new soccer field in the compound** Our current soccer field is across the street and requires adults to watch the children for their safety. The new soccer field will be in the main compound and will enable the children to play without a lot of adult supervision.

**A miracle! Container #1 was brought to the City of Refuge** In mid-July, the container was finally released. Our engineer, Luther, was ecstatic when he saw the corn planter. We no longer have to plant by hand. And he loves the gator. This incredible gift has already blessed the farm. It saves him so much time. I am excited about the wrestling mat. We are calling it the Tim Peterson wrestling room. I am looking forward to seeing all of the sporting goods that came with this large shipment. The kids are going to have a blast! We also received our ice cream machine to put into our restaurant. I would like to give a special thanks to Rev. Jim and Nancy Nygaard for investing in the corn planter and helping arrange the shipping of the container; to Maribelle and Carl Lund for investing in the gator; to Nick from Sioux City, Iowa, who invested in the wrestling mat; to Frank from Bosch tools for helping us get the container through the port; and to Mr. Ron Braatz, CEO of Halydean, who helped us get through the quagmire of the ports. God bless each and every one of them.

**As of August 5th, the second container is still in the port** Please pray.

**IMI is building our first cow barn** The foundation is laid and the walls are going up. The large barn will be 3,300 square feet and is almost as big as our girls orphanage. The cost is \$25,000 and we have raised over \$7,000. We still need \$18,000 to finish it. Please mark **barn** on your check.

# Honduras Highlights

## **Eight-year-old vision is becoming a reality – we are building two two-bedroom apartments**

You have seen the garbage dumps and how the people are suffering. We have broken ground on our first two apartments. The strategy is to build a two-bedroom, two-bathroom apartment for a family in the garbage dump. Then next door, we will build a house for a widow or a poor family from the church with the hopes of the Christian family discipling the poor family. We are now putting up the walls of our first two apartments. (Not to sound confusing, but picture two condos attached.)

## **Security is very important, especially in a third world nation**

**A third of our building monies is going into security for this year** We have five properties at different levels of security.

**The seventy-acre main area** This is where we have our hotel, stores, farm, juice bar, soccer field, apartments, sheep and goat pens. The front part of this property is almost totally secure with walls. All we need to do is put in another gate and the front will be secure. The rest of the seventy acres is barbed wire fence. We are currently in the process of putting in three-block high cement block, and then, eight-foot high chain-link fence topped with barbed wire. This is over one and a half miles and will be a large investment. Phase three will be to put up ten-foot high walls with barbed wire.

**Four acres of orphan compound** In October, we will begin the process of building ten-foot high walls to totally secure the area for our children. It will be spendy, but very secure.

**Four acres with fruit trees** This parcel currently has barbed wire. Our goal later this year is to put in three-block high cement block, and then, chain-link fence topped with barbed wire. This is over one and a half miles and will be another large investment. The third phase will be to put up ten-foot high walls with barbed wire. Plus, we will be building two two-bedroom apartments on the property. This is a must as someone stole our water pump.

**52-acre farm and 62-acre farm** Our goal is to put in three-block high cement block, and then, chain-link fence topped with barbed wire. This is two or three miles in length and will also be a large investment. Phase three is to put up ten-foot high walls with barbed wire. Plus, we will build two two-bedroom apartments on these properties.

**House #3 – We are getting ready to put in the electrical wires** It will also be able to be rented in the near future. Again, it will provide extra income for children and bless God's people. Our next step is to finish the electrical.

**Build in Honduras** Do you trust the government? Do you want a beautiful vacation home? Do you want a house fully paid off? Another crunch is coming – pray about building in Honduras. It's approximately \$30 a square foot. We are now developing the roads to build your Honduran getaway.

## **Thanks to our generous supporters and our great God**

Our transportation truck, that cost \$21,000, has been paid off in July. Praise God!

## **God is good! Through the help of God's people, we were able to raise \$27,500 to buy a much better van**

This van goes to Comayagua on a road that is extremely bumpy. We had been averaging about \$1,000 a month in repairs. But thanks to the generosity of God's people, we will be able to buy a used one that is a lot newer. We were to raise the monies in one month thanks to Ross Eriksmoen and Kent Anderson, both from North Dakota, and the rest of ya'all. Glory to God!

**IMI pays off both trucks in six weeks (over \$27,000)** Thank you, IMI friends, for all you do for orphans.

**Two garages finished** Both garages are done. Praise God, this should help our vehicles to last longer. We currently have four trucks and a van.

## **IMI is setting up five tilapia ponds**

Our first pond is set up and our goal is to start a new pond a month. Eventually, we will have twelve ponds producing a harvest of fish each month which will provide all the fish we need. My hope is to have a full-time fisherman.

**Beans and corn are doing great** Our goal is to increase each month. We plan to add more acres of beans after every harvest.

**IMI plants hundreds of fruit trees and vegetables on our four-acre fruit farm** We are excited to have over 2,000 fruit trees. Our goal is to have 10,000 trees.

**IMI is getting ready to have more baby pigs** Two of our females are about ready to give birth to more pigs. We should have almost thirty pigs by September.

**IMI had a baby calf in July** We also are learning how to manage our cows better. If they aren't producing calves, then we butcher them.

**IMI builds first greenhouse** We are excited to have our first greenhouse finished. We have a load of dirt that has been dropped off and we are beginning to do the planting.

**Rabbit cages** Currently, we are using our rabbit cages for our nine baby chicks. Our rabbits will be coming any day. Our friends, the Vlceks, will be training our kids how to raise rabbits.

**We made our thirteenth payment of \$6,000 for the 52 acres and a house** We passed the halfway mark. We have eleven payments left to pay off this property. The cattle are enjoying 52 acres of food. If you would like to donate for the land, please mark *land* on your offering.

**IMI preparing to print our own T-shirts** In May, we finally were able to invest \$2,000 to fix our T-shirt printer. Blanca Guzman from Chicago will be heading this up. We will also need to raise \$6,000 to buy sewing machines and cutters in Honduras. Please pray for this exciting adventure.

**Other manufacturing plans** We are gearing up to make the dream of building a self-sufficient city another step closer. At the City of Refuge, we are wanting to purchase the necessary equipment for making bricks, as there are other brickmaking factories only two miles away because of the availability of raw materials.

## **Help for Orphans & Widows Worldwide – Guatemala report**

Our HOWW ministry team is in the beginning stages of working in La Limonada (Lemonade), Central America's largest slum, that is built on both sides of a steep mountain ravine. One of our most faithful workers, Isaias, lives there with his wife and children. Before he came to Christ, he was a gang member who wasn't afraid to steal, murder or do anything the gang asked of him. Now he zealously serves Christ and wants others (including La Limonada) to experience Christ's forgiveness and new life. We are responding to this request by taking the first step of preparing the area to receive our team and the precious Gospel of Christ. For a few months, we will serve a community there by weekly feeding a vitamin-enriched soup to their children, families, widows and anyone that's hungry. Once they know who we are and trust us, we will add children's Bible activities and door-to-door evangelism to the food distribution. Please pray that the Lord will open their hearts and that many children and their families will find new lives in Christ.

*Healthy Tip* by Dr. Teresa

**The key to any healthy diet is moderation.** This means eating only as much food as your body physically needs. You should feel satisfied at the end of a meal, but not stuffed.

**Moderation is also about balance.** For most of us, moderation means eating less than we do now, but it doesn't mean eliminating the foods you love. Eating bacon for breakfast once a week, for example, could be considered moderation if you follow it with a healthy lunch and dinner – but not if you follow it with a box of donuts and a sausage pizza. If you eat 100 calories of chocolate one afternoon, balance it out by deducting 100 calories from your evening meal. If you're still hungry, fill up with extra vegetables.

**Try not to think of certain foods as “off-limits.”** When you ban certain foods or food groups, it is natural to want those foods more, and then you feel like a failure if you give in to temptation. Start by



reducing portion sizes of unhealthy foods and not eating them as often. As you reduce your intake of unhealthy foods, you may find yourself craving them less or thinking of them as only occasional indulgences.

**Think smaller portions.** When dining out, choose a starter instead of an entree, split a dish with a friend, and don't order anything supersized. At home, visual cues can help with portion sizes- your serving of meat, fish, or chicken should be the size of a deck of cards and half a cup of mashed potato, rice, or pasta is about the size of a traditional light bulb. If you don't feel satisfied at the end of a meal, add more leafy green vegetables or round off the meal with fruit.

**Take your time.** Stop eating before you feel full. It actually takes a few minutes for your brain to tell your body that it has had enough food, so eat slowly.

**Eat with others whenever possible.** As well as the emotional benefits, this allows you to model healthy eating habits for your kids. Eating in front of the TV or computer often leads to mindless overeating.
