## WISDOM FROM THE *Word* EXCELLENCE—IS WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

*"But since you excel in everything—in faith, in speech, in knowledge, in complete earnestness and in the love we have kindled in you—see that you also excel in this grace of giving." 2 Corinthians 8:7*

We serve a loving King who deserves our very best. Colossians 3:23 says, "...whatever you do, do it heartily, as to the Lord..." Our King doesn't deserve the leftovers—cheap, secondhand, halfhearted non-commitment. He deserves the best. The temple was one of the most beautiful buildings in its day. When the Holy Spirit guided Moses, he chose the best of the best to build the temple. Do we give God our best? Do we treat Him the way we would treat our best friend, our employer, our clients or our family?

How we treat others is how we treat Jesus. If Jesus came to your house, would you give Him the cheap bed, rice and beans and warm water or ignore Him and let Him live on the street? I hope not!!! Jesus told us that whatever we do to the least of our brothers, we do to Him (Matthew 25:40 and 45). We treat our children like we would treat Jesus as if He was a child. When I see the head missionaries living in a palace and the children sleeping on the floor, or the missionaries eating good meals and the children eating rice and beans, I try not to judge, but it's hard. I don't think it's right! *What would Jesus do?*

Education is important, especially in third world nations. My wife is from Peru, a third world nation rapidly becoming a first world nation. My wife was valedictorian of her high school and then moved to Poland where she earned her PhD in medicine. Her best friend in college currently makes \$300,000 a year in Houston as a medical doctor. My wife hires good teachers to help our children succeed. If you ask our children what they want to be when they grow up, the big three occupations are: medical doctors, lawyers, and engineers. To me, education is somewhat less important because I have found the most prosperous people that help us in ministry don't have bachelor's degrees, but they are successful businessmen or farmers. In third world nations, however, uneducated people are almost always poor. We want to break that cycle. *What would Jesus do?*

Healthy, nutritious food is important. We have friends from Hawaii that served in the most famous orphanages in our circles in Africa. They say the spiritual environment is incredible. The meals are like this: breakfast, rice

and beans; lunch, rice and beans; supper, rice and beans and maybe a piece of fruit. Because we raise our own meat, our children get meat at least twice a day: beef, chicken, pork, fish and occasionally rabbit. They are served tortillas and fruit and vegetables, plus a snack or two during the day. They are healthy and happy. We feed them the way we fed our children. *What would Jesus do?*

Our facilities are clean and beautiful. Did you know in the law of Moses that cleanliness was important? The temple was incredibly beautiful. We don't believe in taking children from poverty and giving them a new address of poverty. We provide them with the same kind of housing that we have. They have nice beds, bathrooms and murals on the walls. The City of Refuge is not a mishmash of ugly buildings. We want God to be glorified in all that we do. Excellence is demanded and expected. What kind of housing would you build for Jesus if He lived with you. *What would Jesus do?*

My wife is a granddaughter of a Jewish family from Peru. She was raised in wealth and prosperity. Despite being in the ministry, my children lived in a very nice home and were named best dressed in their high schools. The youngest two had the nicest cars in the school. Should I treat our children in Honduras any different? *What would Jesus do?*

Do you know that one of the tithes that Jewish people were required to pay was for the Feast of Tabernacles during which they took time off, camped and ate good food and sweets? How about in Psalms where it says that in the presence of God there is fullness of joy? The prophet Zechariah talks about children playing. We believe in play therapy. It's proven that when children play and laugh, they get healed!!! Doesn't the Bible say that laughter does good like a medicine? We developed the City of Refuge for children to play and get healed from sexual, physical, emotional and neglectful abuse. It's better than psychology and therapy. We designed our place to be a place of joy. If every child is to be treated as Jesus, then we cannot and will not ever do anything without excellence. *What would Jesus do?*

**Report from Teresa** We learned much during our trip to Guatemala to see a hospital built in the 1800's by a Catholic mission. They see fifty or more patients per day. It is very well set up, even with all their limitations.

They are doing God's work. I was praying to God for the right people to come on board and help us with the design and planning of our hospital. It looks like God has answered my prayers quickly because an engineer from Florida, who built many hospitals, came on the mission trip in February. He was so happy to see my dream and offered to help me with the design. Now, two weeks after going back to America, he sent me tentative drawings. One more time, I can see that God wants to fulfill our dreams. "...Write the vision, and make it plain..." Habakkuk 2:2

Our kids are excited to start their music classes with Dustin Miller from Washington, who came with his family to help develop a worship team with the children. Last month, our good friends, Elaine David and her husband Tom, came to Honduras. What a blessing they were! They bought backpacks for the children, and Tom helped train our guys to fix air conditioners. Also, my good friend, Cherie Anderson, and her family came from Florida to bless us with their awesome team. They built tables and chairs, and Cherie did a great job preaching at Pastor Julio's church.

**Nineteen new children recently added to the City of Refuge**

What a joy to see new children enjoying their new life in the City of Refuge! Three or four years ago, we had eight to ten children who were under the age of two, including newborns. We have a beautiful three-bedroom house just for the little ones. Just a few months ago, I realized that all of our babies were no longer babies. Everyone of them is attending kindergarten or first grade. They are so cute in their new school uniforms and new shoes. Since January, that home has doubled with new children, ages two to six. Like a mom with a newborn child, we are parents of new children. I am touched to see lots of little ones in our newly remodeled children's building. I can't describe the joy of helping these children. It's neat to meet the new boys and girls who are preteens and teenagers. It's cool to see them play soccer, play games, go swimming and interact with the other children.

**We need help - please pray** Of course there are many challenges with taking on new children: adaptation, new relationships, extra work for our educators, potential conflicts - and for me, raising the finances. I wish I didn't have to raise money to pay for everything, but it is what it is. Our orphanage is not a rice and beans and sleep on a straw mat on the floor orphanage. We are not a survival orphanage. Every orphanage and ministry has different purposes. Some provide the bare minimums. Hallelujah! It's better than starving or being sold into prostitution. Some orphanages raise them up and send them out at age eighteen. That's not the City of Refuge. If our children are obedient, we will educate them or hire them when they turn eighteen. Some orphanages have a major emphasis of graduates going to Bible college. Our major emphasis is secular work, based on Bible training and character. We are raising Christians who are professionals and will become the influencers in their family, church, city and nation. Please pray about sponsoring a child at \$30 per month. Each child needs between five to seven sponsors. Thanks and God bless.

**Dentist update** We purchased our very expensive dentist chair, and we are ready to go. There are 20,000 people and no dentists. Jesus said, "I was sick, and you visited me." **IMI has medical mission trips.**



**February mission trip** We had an incredible group of people in February. Rev. Cherie and Randy Anderson brought another awesome group from Florida. Cherie is an ordained minister with IMI, and she preached at Pastor Julio's church, taught evangelism and went on the streets preaching and praying for the sick. Her husband is an incredible businessman who helped his wife, played with the kids and painted. Cherie's parents, Bob and Elaine, who paid for our well, came also. It was Bob's first mission trip. Bob is 76 but works ten hours a day and is stronger than most teens. They loved on the kids, painted and helped us organize the kids' room. Also, Cherie's brother-in-law came with his daughter. He is a professional photographer and gave every child their own photo from his polaroid camera. For some children, this was their very first photo. He also took a group photo of all of our children. He is an incredible athlete and loved on the children. Cherie and Randy's son and niece loved Honduras, instantly bonding with the children and developing lots of friends.

Tom and Elaine from Mankato, Minnesota came to bless the children. Can you imagine that they came on their honeymoon to love on the children for four days? Tom owns an air conditioning and heating company. He was surprised at the number of air conditioners we have. He blessed us by cleaning and setting up a system to keep the air conditioners working. He also took time to train in two of our people. Then, they demonstrated the love of God by buying backpacks for the children, fifty backpacks at \$20 apiece. The children were so proud of their backpacks.

Rev. Michael Raymond and Pastor Skip came all the way from Alaska. Michael is my spiritual son and used to live with me almost twenty years ago. They were extremely impressed with the City of Refuge. Michael teaches missions at a Bible college. Skip also teaches there and is a pastor in Homer, Alaska. They came to scout out our place and see if they will take mission teams from Alaska to Honduras. Go, God!

Rev. Glenn Charles and his wife came to Honduras for the first time. Rev. Glenn and I went to Bible college together, and after graduating, we were both youth pastors in Iowa in towns only forty minutes apart. He worked with YWAM for many years. I recently met up with him through his son at a meeting at an IMI board member's house. Rev. Glenn enjoyed ministering evangelistically and at Pastor Julio's church. His wife ministered daily to our female workers who were touched by God.

Evangelist Greg Moser from La Crosse, Wisconsin, came with two people at the end of February. Greg's commitment to God is to win one person a day to Jesus. We will report their results next month.

Waiting is not my specialty, but we are believing and praying that people will donate and help us build a safe house. There's 185,000 people and not one safe house. I met a very successful businessman in Hawaii who said that the number one place for sex trafficking is the southern tip of the island. This is exactly where we are located. Hmmm! May be a God thing! I have a couple from Iowa that would be dynamite working at the safe house. The husband's skills include construction and writing grants. He is a pioneer and has accomplished at least three firsts in the state of Iowa. His wife has worked with hurting women all of her adult life. She is skilled in rescuing women and children and has a heart of adoption. They are hungry to do something significant for the kingdom of God. They are even open to moving there. Please pray for them. We have the plans to build a safe house; all we need is enough money to get the permits so we can begin building. To donate mark **safe house** on your check. ## Healthy Teaching by Dr. Teresa

### Route to Optimal Health

Glycemic index of various vegetables and fruits



#### Vegetables

##### Low GI – 15 or less

Zucchini, spinach, peppers, onions, mushrooms, lettuce, alfalfa sprouts, artichokes, asparagus, cucumber, squash, Brussels sprouts, broccoli, bell peppers, leeks, chives, celery, cauliflower, chili pepper

##### GI 20 or more

Eggplant, raw carrots, green beans

##### High GI – over 50

Peas, taro, corn, canned red beets (64), canned carrots (80)



#### Fruit

##### Very low – GI 30 or less

Avocado (10), olives (15), limes (20), lemons (20), raspberries (25), blackberries (25), grapefruit (25), cherries (25), tomatoes (30)

##### Low GI – under 50

Apples (30), nectarines (30), peaches (30), pears (30), strawberries (35), oranges (35), dried apricots (35), plums (35), figs (40)

##### High GI – over 50

Kiwi (50), grapes (53), blueberries (53), fresh apricots (57), pineapple (59), bananas (60), mango (61), cantaloupe (67), watermelon (76)

Functional vegetables and fruits are rich in vitamins, minerals, phytochemicals and fiber; therefore, they are the core of your long-term plan to reach and maintain optimal health. Because they are low in calories and provide plenty of bulk to fill you up, they are a great tool to help you take charge of your energy intake.

The dysfunctional fried vegetables, typical of fast food chains and other restaurants, as well as many packaged fruit juices have been stripped of their nutrients and loaded with fat and/or sugar.

**Long-term missionaries**

Joshua continues to knock the ball out of the park. He is about as perfect as a person can be. He gave up his high-paying job to serve Jesus. We love Josh!

Pam Arnold plans to come in April. She has spoken in churches to create awareness and to sell the children's jewelry which raises money for their education.

Dustin Miller with his wife, three children and mother-in-law from Seattle arrived at the end of February. They are excited about teaching worship and cooking. Their house is beautiful and we bought all of the appliances for them. They will be purchasing their beds, and then, they will move in. Glory to God!

Pray for Brian and Cathy Grey. Cathy is going to have an emergency surgery. We will have to wait until they can make the move. The good news is that their little house is ready.

**To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year**

100% of the monies goes to the school and ZERO goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.

**Help a child to go to college** We enjoyed spending time with our eldest daughter, Adriana. We are so proud of her. She loves the children and is getting ready to enter her third year of college to become a doctor. IMI is looking for six sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$300 a month or one sponsor for \$600 a month. Please pray about helping her with college and mark **Adriana** on your check.

**IMI reaches out to the community school**

There is a public elementary school right next to our school. They have almost no recreation or sports opportunities. They don't have air conditioning and their buildings are not even painted. So when I was there, we let them use our soccer field. It was neat to watch them have fun and play and a couple of them actually said thank you and gave us hugs.

**Weight training and hard work are paying off**

As a former weight trainer and instructor and athlete, I have noticed our children are getting pumped up. The boys are getting stronger, and it won't be long before they surpass Papi Tom. Even Wendy has amazing biceps for a girl. We got her when she was four and weighed ten pounds and her hair was white and patchy from starvation. Now she is healthy. Hallelujah!

**Multipurpose building** The engineer says the plans should be finished in March. Then, we will get the bids and start construction. By hiring professionals, it takes longer to prep the work, but it eliminates costly mistakes.

**Duplex is morphing into a triplex** They are almost finished bringing in the water from the well. The trench is dug, and they need to lay the pipes. When the pipes are laid, Torres will finish the third part of the triplex. This only a two-month project, and we are getting closer and closer to completion. Three families are going to be incredibly blessed.

**Missionary house is finished** We started two and a half years ago and it is finally finished. It is a beautiful home. Glory to God! Thanks for giving!

**Building projects during the months of February and March**

Our six contractors and welder/maintenance man with his crew are busy.

**Torres** is concentrating on turning our duplex into a triplex. The triplex should be finished in April. At the request of our agricultural engineer, we are then going to have Torres build a tractor and implement building. The extreme heat and the rain ruin our equipment. So we are bumping back construction for the hospital for two months. This gives my wife and our engineers time to design the hospital. Estimated start date is July 1st.

**Omar** reports that the walls of the 150 to 175-bed dormitory should be completed by mid-March. Then we will hire a plumber to come in for \$7,000 and do all the rough-ins. When the walls are finished, Omar will begin to prep the walls to put on a massive roof. God is good! This is our second largest building to date. Lots of boys will be rescued. Omar has another project that should be finished in March. We have two school buildings – a large one and a small one. The small one is a football field away from the school bathrooms. So Omar is building two bathrooms. He has the walls and roof done. Hallelujah!

**Navoth and his two brothers** have totally finished the preteen building. Hallelujah! They have been working on three projects at a time. The government told us we need more windows in the schools, so we put in extra large windows for all of the classrooms. Pulperia (which is our small grocery store, bakery and kitchen) has been expanded. The workers were too crowded and had to share the sinks. We added about five extra feet along the total length of the building which actually made a huge difference. We doubled the sinks and added more room for the workers and groceries. The crew will be done with this expansion by the second week of March. In January, they broke ground on our art room and a music room and an apartment. The walls are nearly done and they will put on the roof. Then the crew will do the electrical, flooring, plastering, painting and windows and doors. This is a very rare thing to have an art and music room. We are excited for the children to play music, learn worship and develop their artistic skills. When that is finished, we will be adding an apartment. We project the finish date will be end of June. Then the crew will begin to build a strip mall. This mall will be 36 feet by almost 200 feet. The first building will be a mechanical shop for autos and motorcycles, and we will sell parts for them. We already have a full-time mechanic. Then we will build four stores – hardware, agricultural, furniture and clothing. These shops will create income for the orphanage and training and jobs for our children. Another major benefit will be reaching out to the people in the fourteen villages.

**Rodolfo** finished the windows and doors in the preteen building, the roof on the butcher shop, and the windows and doors on the missionary house and duplex in February. He also finished welding the chain-link fence around the volleyball court. That way we have an enclosed court. In March and April, Rodolfo will be working on doors and windows in the pulperia and the school.

**Julio** has a unique and high skill level which we are using for the tourism aspect of the City of Refuge. He has begun work on a 16-month pool project designed to put us on the tourism map in Honduras. The flooring is done, and Julio is working on the walls.

**Moises** has completed the walls on the butcher shop, and with the finishing of the roof, he can put in the flooring and plaster the interior. This building has to be designed just right, as we are going to be butchering a lot of meat. This will be so much more sanitary than butchering outside and will put us in a position to sell our meat to high-end restaurants and grocery stores. Currently, Moises is building a chain-link fence and a new door into the boys orphanage to separate the boys entrance from the girls. His next project will be building housing on our farms across the river. The number one problem we have in agriculture is "two-legged coyotes". Besides giving people homes, the thieves will see that we have people with eyes. The first one will be next to the gate. People constantly come in and cut our trees, and in the past, they would steal our grain.

**Well report** We hit water to irrigate our corn and beans. Hallelujah!

**Missionary gives donation to buy a grass and corn stalk cutter** The corn stalk cutter is a mega blessing. My engineer told me that one of the benefits of raising corn is that we can feed the cattle, sheep, goats and horses the stalks and husks. But much is wasted. The animals pee and poop on the food, and then, they won't eat it. But thanks to a missionary, we purchased the machine and are waiting for it to be delivered. It will chop up the corn husks and stalks and the grass, and we won't waste this precious resource. Thanks, sister.

**Cattle** We have new baby calves, two males and one female. All the calves are doing great. Seven of our pregnant heifers have our new Holstein bull as the father. This will greatly increase our milk production.

**Goats and sheep** In 2017, thirteen baby goats and ten baby sheep have been born. Glory to God!

**Pigs** We had six baby pigs and seven of the sows are pregnant.

**Tilapia** The tilapia tanks are finished, but they leak. So we have to spend \$1,800 per tank to put membranes on them to seal them. Bummer! But we live and learn. Three of the tilapia ponds are in operation, and the fourth will be ready in March. By March, we will be raising 8000 tilapia. Hallelujah!

**Eggs are selling so fast, we cannot keep up** These are some of the biggest eggs that I have ever seen. They are about fifty percent bigger than large eggs in the USA. The new chickens are laying eggs like crazy, but we still can't keep up with the demand in the store. We now have 800 hens laying 500-600 eggs a day.

**Turkeys** A lizard almost destroyed all of our turkeys, but thank God, we are bouncing back with three new baby turkeys.

**Missionary donates money to plant fifty mango trees** An average mango tree will produce 350 pounds of fruit a year at a dollar a pound. Over forty years, a tree can produce over \$15,000 worth of mangos. What can fifty produce? Our goal is to have 10,000 mango trees. They take three to five years to produce.
