Word

Scary Verses - Part 4

"Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the people of Israel; so hear the word I speak and give them warning from me. When I say to a wicked person, 'You will surely die,' and you do not warn them or speak out to dissuade them from their evil ways in order to save their life, that wicked person will die for their sin, and I will hold you accountable for their blood." Ezekiel 3:17-18

I was finishing my newsletter at a gas station/minimart in a small town in Iowa when I heard a man cuss over and over again. His vocabulary was pretty small as about one-third of his words were cuss words. Personally, cuss words don't bother me, but what does bother me is when people use the name of Jesus Christ or say God d****t. I cringed everytime he cursed God. The fear of God fell on me that he was cursing God, the lover of his soul and that he would be judged for that. But I never said anything. I talked myself out of saying something because it was none of my business. But, God says his blood is on my hands. How many people do we walk by and we don't share the salvation story? How many churches don't give people an opportunity to give their hearts to Christ? They say we don't want to offend people, so let's not give them an opportunity to receive Jesus. It is true that the gospel is offensive, but if we don't warn people and they don't have Jesus as Savior, then they will really be offended on the Day of Judgment.

In Romans 10:14, Paul asked a question, "How can they hear without a preacher?" It seems as if we are responsible to share the love of Jesus with people. If we don't, they won't know the saving power of the Lord Jesus. If we don't share, is their blood on our hands? We are warned that if we are friends with the world, we are at enmity with God. What's more important, pleasing God or pleasing people? There are many types of evangelism: Signs and wonders, the preaching of the gospel, apologetics (suffering with grace), answered prayers, apologetics (defending the faith), humanitarian deeds and friendship evangelism. The last two are the most effective, but if we are not careful, we can love people and help people and befriend people and never share the gospel with them.

Why don't we want to warn people?

- People will think we are crazy.
- We are afraid of rejection.
- We are afraid of persecution.
- We want there to be peace and harmony.
- We love this world more than the next.

Let me add this: Don't just share the gospel, ask for a decision. In June, one of my rental cars began to ride rough, and it was getting loud. I already had one tire that I had to pay for. Two of my friends said it might be bearings or bad tires. So I set up an appointment to exchange it in two days. As I was driving two days later to pick up my car, I called them to remind them that I was coming to pick up another rental. It was then that they informed me that every car in Minnesota was rented out. I wasted an hour. So I drove to Des Moines the next day. We got into our newer rental car and the plug-in sockets for our GPS and cell phone were not working. So I had to wait for the Hertz mechanic to fix it. I found a place to work out in Des Moines and a kind fellow let me in to a 24-hour workout place. However, the manager wasn't in and he didn't return the phone call. So I had to leave. As I was just walking out of the gym, I looked at a young man and said, "Sudan. Have you been there?"

He said, "Yes, my family is from there." As I am walking out to my car (for a third delay to my "important plan for the day"), I received a phone call from the fitness center manager that I could work out. Hallelujah! Finally, something is going right. To make a long story short, everyone left the workout gym except for two Sudanese men in the workout gym. Everyone left except for them. God opened a door for them to receive Jesus, and they did. Three delays, but two people received Jesus. God is good! I am so happy I shared Jesus with them. Did not Jesus say, "...there is more joy in heaven when one sinner repents than a hundred who don't need to repent"?

Try it. You will like it!!!

Report from Teresa The good news is that Nicol, who was in the hospital with a severe kidney infection, is now back home and is doing very well. Of course, we have a big medical bill, but we saved her life. Thank you very much for your prayers and financial support.

One night, I was sleeping when I got a call from Samantha, our intern who is studying to be a nurse, informing me that one of our girls, Alexandra, had severe abdominal pain. I immediately rushed to her dorm to check on her. She had all the signs and symptoms of acute appendicitis. Our City of Refuge is thirty minutes away from the big city of Comayagua. On the bad roads, Josh and I drove her to where she was operated on immediately. The surgeon said that if we didn't bring her right away, her appendix would have burst. It would have been very dangerous and, of course, more expensive. Thank God, we got her there on time. We had favor and were given a discount because the doctor is Pastor Julio's friend. Even though we ended up with one more medical bill, this time for \$1,200, we saved her life. Alexandra had the opportunity to spend time with her mom who came to take care of her.

Not everything is a tragedy; we had good times also. In June, some of our older children went to a camp with an organization called *Young Life*. Antonio, Omar, Alex, Kenia, Tania, and Paola were inspired by the activities and the biblical messages. Back at the City of Refuge, a few nights later after a campfire, they shared their experiences and, overall, rated it a nine or ten!

Another trip involved a number of our younger kids, when another orphanage invited us and about ten other orphanages for a visit. During the playground time, Carmen and Guadalupe, our twins, had fun on the teeter-totter. Rodolfo enjoyed showing off on the monkey bars, skipping every other and going faster than anyone else. Then, we had games, a short Bible lesson and lunch. Later, they gave us T-shirts saying "Soy Amado", which means "I am loved", and sent us outside for an activity where all the kids were in teams, chasing other teams and attacking them with colored powder socks! We all came out laughing, covered from head to toe in various colors! Our children all had a blast, and it was unanimously the best activity of the day.

The kids are having a short vacation and are enjoying Mike and Cindy Schupbach's pizza and ice cream. They are awesome. As you know, we have Dustin Miller and his family as long-term missionaries. Dustin is teaching music to the kids. We also have Katrina who teaches piano and Emely Hennek who teaches guitar and drums. You will like this. Our children, after being rebellious, now are learning to play music and even leading worship. It is awesome to watch how passionate they are for being in the presence of God. We prayed for God to do a miracle, and I think it is happening.

Major medical problem Nicole was our youngest child for many years. She was diagnosed with a severe kidney infection and has been in the hospital four times in the last two months. Her whole body swelled up. Her temperature was so high, she could have died of a heart attack. We picked her up from the hospital on June 12th. She is so sweet and cute and loveable. The cost of her medical bills were \$3,200. Please help us. We don't have it in the budget, and there is no insurance in Honduras. Please mark **Nicole** or **medical** on your envelope.

We are exploring what worship is and how we respond to God. As we spend time soaking in worship and reflection, God has been bringing freedom to His children to worship and to minister as He leads. These children love worship and are showing tremendous growth. In the upcoming months, we look forward to seeing what new gifts God will pour into them.

Meaghan has a degree in sociology and helps with the children under seven. She teaches, feeds, bathes and helps the little children. Our kindergarten teacher is sick, so Meaghan took over for her for six weeks. The Miller children are getting more adjusted and are making friends. They love sports and music.

Brian and Cathy Gray Brian and Cathy have been coming since the beginning. Brian has been here the fourth most of any person with IMI. The Grays are graduates of Heidi Baker's ministry in Africa. Brian has produced our new powerful and extremely impacting video. Wow! Check it out. He is doing one-minute updates each week and will be teaching video, animation, and drones. Brian is also working with the male interns, is reaching out to the community in evangelism and will be teaching our social workers how to deal with difficult children. Cathy is working with our seven female interns, and she also is reaching out to the community as we are getting ready to plant a new church. Cathy is taking many photographs. They are focusing on video, evangelism and working with problem children. It's been a long time coming.

Meaghan Miller is an awesome kindergarten teacher

We have been working very hard on number recognition. The children have been doing many math games and creating numbers with playdough. After only two weeks, most of them are able to name numbers 1-5 in Spanish and English. They are learning to measure, too. We also have been using the book *Brown Bear, Brown Bear (Oso Café, Oso Café)*. Everyday, when they come into class, they find a picture of a bear or other animal in the book to show me. They are so proud of themselves that they can remember the story and all the colors. Many of the children have been struggling with color recognition, and now, almost all of them can recognize at least eight colors and say them in Spanish and English.

Retirement village Melonie from Sacramento, California, moved in May 3rd. She enjoys helping the children get ready in the morning and doing dishes. She is a great athlete and is a prayer warrior. Melonie and Cathy Gray have bonded, and they go to the mountains to pray for hours. We have seen incredible breakthroughs in her life.

Swanson, a music teacher from River Falls, Wisconsin, taught music, worked with Dustin Miller (our music missionary) and loved playing sports with the children. * Ryan, a dairy farmer from River Falls, helped with cooking and building gutters for the chicken barns and is an incredible athlete. * Chelsea, a hair stylist also from River Falls, cut hair and taught our second oldest daughter (Vanessa, age 18), along with some of the ladies in the community, to cut hair. * Janet's daughter, who will be a sophomore at Luther College in Decorah, Iowa, is on her first mission trip and is helping with the music, bonding with the children and playing sports.

Interns: Hannah, from a college in Missouri, who is a daughter of a missionary, will be leaving at the end of June. She totally bonded with the children and was a great helper. We all love Hannah and will miss her greatly. * Samantha, the granddaughter of Mike and Cindy, is helping our doctor everyday. Samantha is studying to be a nurse and hopes to move to Honduras and work in our hospital when she graduates. * Miss McGinnis, whose dad is on staff at Open Bible Church in Kankakee, Illinois, was saved in our ministry when she was four. She loves spending time with the children and is pouring into them. This is her first time away from her parents, and she is loving every minute of her stay.

We are so honored to host Mrs.

International 2016, Priscilla Pruitt, and her husband Shawn

They are a very special couple because they helped us build our first dormitory here in the City of Refuge. They love our place, and they love the children and are having a great time with them. Priscilla is cutting hair, playing with the kids and loving on them. Shawn is very good with computers. He will come up with a system that will protect our computers and internet from hackers. They are a powerful couple. Priscilla is an advocate for *Baby Drop Boxes*, a program to rescue more babies. We are talking details about making this happen here in Comayagua, Honduras. Pray for us.

Another dream come true We built two beautiful apartments with two bedrooms, two bathrooms, a pantry, kitchen, living room, etc. and our first family moved in. It is the family of Pastor Julio's brother who hasn't been able to find a job in over two years. They were extremely poor and had nothing. Both parents are now working for us, and their daughter is now attending our school. Go, Jesus!

To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year

100% of the monies goes to the school and ZERO goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.

Help a child go to college We are so proud of our eldest daughter, Adriana. She is in her third year of college to become a doctor. IMI is looking for six sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$300 a month or one sponsor for \$600 a month. Please pray about helping her become a doctor and mark **Adriana** on your check.

11,000-square-foot building Thanks to Caruth Construction, we will be sending approximately \$10,000 to run electricity up the mountain. We will have to have a new transformer. This electrical project will power the 176-bed dormitory, the 11,000 square-foot multi-purpose building, the recreational area for the Bible camp, houses for residents and also another hotel. We also will be sending \$6,000 to get the land prepped to lay the cement. We should be doing that sometime in August.

Mini-mall plans complete We broke ground in June. This will make an incredible impact in the fourteen small towns of 20,000 people as this will be the only shopping center in the area. There will be seven stores, 17 feet by 26, which will probably include a pharmacy, clothing, furniture, agricultural, hardware and second-hand store, and one other. We will also have a mechanic shop that will sell auto and motorcycle parts. This will be a one and a half to two-year project. The strategy is to be self-sufficient.

Construction projects – contractor report

Omar is working on the 176-bed dormitory. On July 1st, we are sending \$12,000 for the roof. It should be finished by August, and at that time, we will be ready for the next stage of electrical to be done. Then, Omar will pour cement for the floor.

Torres As soon as Torres is finished with the triplex, he will be working on our largest building to date. He will start August 1st. It will take four months to lay the platform, and then, we will work on the pillars. This building will be used for revival meetings, concerts, church, Bible camp, soccer, basketball and volleyball. Besides the bleachers, if we put the chairs in the court, we should be able to seat 800-plus people. My good friends have pledged \$40,000. *Thanks, Caruth Construction!* This is a one- to three-year project. Go, God! Total Cost: \$275,000. Jehovah Jireh! After that, he will start our ten-year project to build our 25,000-square-foot hospital. We will be able to accommodate more beds than any hospital in the state and the fifth largest city in Honduras.

Hernandez brothers The add-on to our small grocery store and bakery will be completed at the end of June. Julio will lay special flooring so our cooks don't slip and slide. Then the three Hernandez brothers will finish the ceiling and paint. We are excited to get our grocery store and bakery back. The grand opening will be sometime in August. As of mid-June, the ceiling and the electrical in the art and music rooms are finished. As soon as the store is done, the crew will put in tiles and windows and do the painting. We are stoked about these two new rooms. As of June 20th, they will begin to pour a cement slab for our mechanical shop. Our mechanic has no place to work. In July and August, we will send \$2,500 a month to work on our mechanic shop, and when that is finished, they will continue on and work on the rest of the strip mall. In September, we will be investing \$5,000 a month, as the Lord provides. This will create jobs, earn money for the orphanage, provide retail training for our children and allow us to meet more people in the fourteen communities that surround our city.

Rodolfo is working on windows for the triplex and store/bakery, and then, he will work on the roof of the extremely large area for our girls laundry room plus outdoor hangout place.

Moises is working on a few projects. We added another ninety feet of security fence with barbed wire, because a dog could have knocked that fence over. That fence was originally built in 2009. God is good. Moises is working on an addition to the boys dorms. He should be finishing the roof, electrical, plaster, and paint by the end of July. His next project will be to build housing on our farms across the river. The number one problem we have in agriculture is "two-legged coyotes". Besides giving people homes, the thieves will see that we have people with eyes. The first one will be next to the gate. People constantly come in and cut our trees, and in the past, they would steal our grain.

Julio is working on a number of projects. Currently, he is putting the flooring in our store/bakery. This is a special tile so our girls won't slip and slide. In July, Julio will finish putting the floors in our butcher shop. Then, all we have left is the stainless steel, and we are ready to go. Hallelujah! the flooring is done on our third pool which will be used for tourism. We need to put up a restraining wall to keep the dirt from coming in. In September and October, we will be installing the fiberglass in the pool. We will then begin building the two slides. This will put us on the tourism map in Honduras.

Farming prayers Please pray for safety and multiplication of animals. Pray against thieves. Pray for new equipment needed and rain.

Big dream fulfilled Both of our greenhouses are in full operation. We are raising cucumbers, cauliflower, radishes, tomatoes and beets. Our goal is to build three more large greenhouses to raise all of our own vegetables.

52-acre farm We are having high protein grass seed, called Mombassa from Africa, planted on six of the eleven parcels. This will help produce more grass for our cattle. From August to November, we will clear the remaining five parcels of land to raise high protein grass.

Corn and beans We just planted a field of corn and are harvesting beans, PTL.

Rabbits We had six baby rabbits when I was in Honduras, so now, we have over twenty rabbits.

Ducks and turkeys Once the butcher shop is done, we will expand the duck and turkey houses.

We invested \$2,000 (new \$5,000) in a machine that plucks feathers Every Saturday, we butcher chickens. This will save us a lot of labor and money and make us more efficient. God is our provider. Hallelujah!

Pigs We are trading forty baby pigs to buy 400 hens. In June, we invested in pig feeders. This saves us from wasting a lot of food. We are getting more modern each month.

Cattle We have forty cows, and six are pregnant. Within three years, we have gone from three to almost fifty by the end of this year. Glory to God!

Sheep, goats, horses We have 45 sheep and goats. We had two baby horses in June. One was born when we were here. They are cute!

Tilapia We bought netting to stop the birds from eating our fish. We will buy more fish for the ponds.

Fruit trees We are currently harvesting our guavas and over 250 mangoes. *NEWS!* We had the first avocados ever on our farm. Hallelujah!



Destiny Center is a mega project in Wisconsin with sixteen acres and over 40,000

square feet of buildings We made our first payment on June 15th. We are believing and praying that we will have it paid off by September or October this year. Glory to God! By the end of the month, we are going to pay a contractor to put in sliding glass windows and more windows in the barn. The barn will be used for weddings.

Our goals are to protect abused women and children, help dysfunctional people become functional, have conferences, become self-sufficient by raising dogs and gardens, board horses to earn money and to bring healing to the hurting and develop other streams of income to help orphanages. We need * your prayers of protection for wisdom and angelic help * finances to pay for building and remodeling * food, clothing, furniture, housewares, hygiene, toys and games * a tractor to mow grass and plow snow * volunteers to remodel the buildings (the former people trashed it) * decorators to make it beautiful * business partners to develop income streams and earn money * counselors * building supplies * YOU! Progress at the Destiny Center We are making connections, including the principal of the New Lisbon elementary school. Also, we are sending contractors to check out the property. We were blessed to have Harry Armstrong (plumbing) and Pastor Don Bell (sheet rock) come and check it out. Pastor Jared ordered a big door for the entrance of the Destiny Center. We are needing volunteers to work outdoors with landscaping, planting, mulching, fencing – and indoors with drywalling, painting, ceiling tiles, cleaning, moving furniture. We made a large investment in our land for our safe house in the southernmost part of the USA We have paid off 45% of the property in the last nine months. Hallelujah!

From Belize missionary, Sam Barber We are now in our deputation time and are enjoying the USA. But, like anything else, what we do needs to be bathed in prayer. Here are some prayer suggestions from the book, *Raising People*. Thank God for your missionaries. Write to them and pray faithfully for them and their children. Pray for the daily lives of your missionaries, that God will provide for all their needs physically, emotionally, spiritually, and financially. Pray that your missionaries will use their time wisely, that barriers will be minimized and that the Holy Spirit will lead them to hearts prepared to hear the gospel. So, as we travel, I hope that you will pray for us and consider supporting our work in Belize. Always remember to write **Belize/Barber** in the memo line.

Belize – eleven acres paid off We are praying for guidance. There are many options – farming, tourism, housing, creating jobs. We are believing and praying for the resources to invest in Belize. Right now, there is no money in the general fund to do that. We are praying that God will lay on someone's heart to give a donation, and then, we will make the next step. Once we pay off two of our properties, we should have the funds to invest in Belize.

TEA TREE OIL

Tea tree, also known as Melaleuca, is well-known for its powerful antiseptic properties and ability to treat wounds. This oil, from the Australian native plant *Melaleuca alternifolia*, has been widely used throughout Australia for at least the past hundred years. For over seven decades, numerous medical studies have documented that it kills many strains of bacteria, viruses and fungi.

It is becoming an increasingly popular active ingredient in a variety of household and cosmetic products, such as face wash, shampoos, massage oils, skin and nail creams and laundry detergents. Tea tree's natural antiseptic and anti-inflammatory actions make it an essential oil that should truly be part of everyone's natural medicine cabinet.

Some of the many traditional uses for tea tree include healing chickenpox, bacterial infections, cold sores, fungal infections (especially candida, jock itch, athlete's foot and toenail fungus), halitosis (bad breath), head lice, psoriasis, dry cuticles, itchy insect bites, sores and sunburns, ringworm and boils from staph infections.

Because of its ability to kill parasites and fungal infections, tea tree oil is a great choice to use on toenail fungus, athlete's foot and ringworm. Put tea tree oil undiluted on the affected area using a clean cotton swab. And for stubborn fungi, consider mixing it with natural anti-fungal oil of oregano. Tea tree oil has also been proven beneficial for treating and removing warts by simply putting tea tree oil directly on the area once or twice daily for thirty days.
