WISDOM FROM THE *Word*

*The tongue has the power of life and death,
and those who love it will eat its fruit.* – Proverbs 18:21

*“The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among
the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole body,
and sets the whole course of one's life on fire,
it is itself set on fire by hell.”* – James 3:6

How many children's lives have been destroyed,
dreams demolished, divorces developed, businesses
broken up, churches split, and even wars started
because of the tongue? Protect us, Lord, from our
own tongue.

The sins of the tongue are many. Pick your poison:
Gossip, slander, criticism, complaining, blasphemy,
harshness... The tongue is a channel that flows from
the heart and the very inner being of a person. It can
express hatred, bigotry, anger, adultery, division,
manipulation, witchcraft, judging, and lust.

On the flip side, the tongue can be an incredible
blessing. To God, we can worship, praise and offer
thanksgiving. To man, we can encourage, strengthen,
build up, comfort, give wisdom and offer freedom.

Don't be hung by the tongue. Ten pointers:

- Think before you speak.

- Empty your cup of bitterness, anger and unforgiveness. Ask God to replace your heart (where the fountains of life flow) with love, compassion, zeal for God, purpose and destiny.

Report from Teresa The children studied very, very hard in school and a lot of them had very good grades. They studied hard in school and then had a good time on their spring Easter break. A few children went to visit their families. The ones that stayed had lots of fun having music classes, swimming and playing soccer every day and going to Pastor Julio's church and the mountain church. We also had a party for Labor Day at the pool with the workers. We had Pastor Julio preach, and they had a great swimming time. It was awesome!

We will have more children coming to the City of Refuge. The psychologist and social worker have been visiting the families to prepare every detail for them to move in ASAP. We had two families ready to move in to the duplex. As the psychologist and social worker kept investigating so that all would go well, they found out that one of the families is drinking alcohol. We cannot allow that to happen in the City of Refuge because we can get in big trouble with the government. We must be an example for the children. Some of the people in the garbage dump who were interviewed prefer to stay there and do drugs. We are still looking for the right people to come. I know there are ones who want to work and want to accept Jesus in their lives and give their children a chance to be in a better environment. For now, there is a single father who has no place to stay who would be able to work for us. God will bring the right people to stay there.

We have a new missionary who arrived three days ago. Her name is Melanie. She is ready to give a hundred percent of her life to love and care for the children. We are also very excited to have our friends, Brian and Cathy Grey, missionaries from Hawaii, arrive for long-term service with us in the City of Refuge. Pray for them and for all our long-term missionaries in Honduras. Life on the mission field is not easy.

April mission trip We had a college student come down for a week to minister. Her name is Liz Royce. I met her at Pastor Hermon Colon's church two years ago, and she is on-fire. She says, "In Honduras, I played with the kids most of the time and observed the classrooms briefly. In addition to that, I spent time getting to know the missionaries and the young children while the nannies were in meetings. I also helped the children study for their exams they had the week before Holy Week." Liz enjoyed the children immensely. She plans on moving there after she finishes her master's degree in elementary education.

Report by Dustin, missionary and music teacher Things are sounding great down in Honduras. I have been working with the kids here on music, both in the classroom and in a one-on-one setting. In the classes, we are working on singing and I will soon be starting a choir with the kids who show the aptitude and the desire to be a part of it. I am currently doing one-on-one lessons with twenty kids on guitar, piano and drums. All of the kids in these lessons are enthusiastic about the opportunity to be playing an instrument. Many of them have a true worshiper's heart and display a love for Jesus every time they touch their instrument of choice. I am already starting to see who I think will be able to form the first worship team here. I can't wait for the time when they lead the rest of the city in worship. We are looking forward to what the next month will bring in their development.

Art and music rooms Dustin is excited to get the music room going. These two classrooms should be finished by the end of June. In May, I am bringing two instruments to Honduras. We will have 42 instruments.

To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year 100% of the monies goes to the school and ZERO goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.

Help a child to go to college We have enjoyed our time with our eldest daughter, Adriana. We are so proud of her. She loves the children and is in her third year of college to become a doctor. IMI is looking for six sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$300 a month or one sponsor for \$600 a month. Please pray about helping her become a doctor and mark **Adriana** on your check.

Internship – new opportunity Send your high school or college student on a mission internship to Honduras. From Missouri, we have a female college student, who is studying to be a social worker, coming for three months. From Illinois, we have a female freshman college student coming in May for three months. From Wisconsin, we have a music teacher coming for three weeks. Potentially, we will also have two high school students from Illinois and Georgia and two college freshmen from Iowa and Wisconsin. Long-term missionaries Joshua Otte went home in April and will be back in June. He is the right hand man for sure at the orphanage. We are looking forward to the day that he will have his residency and can stay in Honduras long-term. Praise God for Joshua.

Dustin and Meghan Miller and their family from Seattle are settled into their new three-bedroom home. Dustin is teaching music three to four times a day. He also is teaching guitar and piano and drums to our children after school. Joshua helped out the missionary teams. He is beginning to bond with the children. Meghan is helping with the kindergarteners who are slower in learning than their peers. They also helped out making pizzas and ice cream. Dustin learned how to run the ice cream machine. The children are adjusting well to the new changes.

May 1st we welcome Melanie Haggard She will be moving from California and will be one of our retired ladies. We are excited to see our retirement village coming to pass. Yay!

Protect your future – move to the City of Refuge Do you trust the government? Do you want a beautiful vacation home? Do you want a house fully paid off? Another crunch is coming – pray about building in Honduras. It's approximately \$30 a square foot.

Brian and Cathy are moving in May 4th, hallelujah! It's been a long time coming. Cathy's test results came in healthy so they are coming. They will focus on video, evangelism and working with problem children.

Sewing room update Our "Sewing Queen" is coming to Honduras in June! Her name is Blanca. We are pumped. Her room is ready to go.

Dentist update We purchased our very expensive dentist chair, and we are ready to go. There are 20,000 people and no dentists. Jesus said, "I was sick, and you visited me."

Duplex is completely finished It's been a long process, but it is finished!!! We thank God that our dream of rescuing families from the dumps is finally beginning to materialize. We are excited about the updates of the new families and the changed that are going to be made. Can you imagine living in a garbage dump? Then one day, you get a brand new place to live, a job, Christian bilingual education, monthly presents, and all the fun activities a child could want. Hallelujah! Our first family should be moving in any day.

IMI makes a very important transition

Our contractors are very skilled and very talented, yet nobody knows it all. Mistakes have been made especially in the plumbing (smell) and the electrical (dangerous). So we have hired two specialists in electrical and plumbing. This makes it easier for our contractors to bid and to focus on foundations, walls, roofing, flooring, etc.

Mini-mall plans complete In order to be self-sufficient, we need to develop streams of income. We have an interpreter who said that he works with four other orphanages in Comayagua. All of them want to be self-sufficient, but we are the only ones who are going in that direction. The first building will be a mechanic shop that will sell auto and motorcycle parts. We already have a full-time mechanic. Then, we will build seven stores, 17 feet by 26 – which will probably include a pharmacy, clothing, furniture, agricultural, hardware and second-hand store, and one other. These shops will create income for the orphanage and training and jobs for our children. Another major benefit will be reaching out to the people in the fourteen villages. Ground breaking is July 1, 2017. It will be a one and a half to two-year project.

Engineer just finished plans for our small strip mall

Currently, he is working on our hospital plans. Five days a week he checks our projects, tells us how much material we need, checks prices, evaluates what we are spending and how to save money, and draws up one set of plans each month. In May, he is beginning the complex design of our 48,000-square-foot hospital.

Our plumbing engineer just finished the rough-in plumbing for twenty stalls and twenty showers for our 200-bed orphanage.

Groundbreaking June 1st on 11,000-square-foot building – thanks, Caruth Construction This multipurpose building will be used for revival meetings, concerts, church, Bible camp, basketball, soccer and volleyball. With the bleachers and chairs set up in the court, we should be able to seat 800-plus people. My good friends have pledged \$40,000 (I just picked up the first check of \$10,000 in April). In June, we will build the \$20,000 square foot platform and footings. We are now waiting for bids for that. Hallelujah! This is a one- to four-year project. Go, God! Total cost: \$275,000.

Construction projects – contractor report

Omar continued to work on the roof of the 175-bed dormitory in April. The roof is a four-month project. When it is finished, they will put in the electricity and then begin the flooring. This is a 7,000-square-foot building. It is huge! The rough-in plumbing is finished. The building is really progressing. It's our second biggest building so far. We are excited to see what God is going to do. Estimated finish time is ten to twelve months. When we are finished, this may be the largest dormitory for orphans or Bible camp in Honduras.

Torres has started the triplex. Half of the triplex addition has the walls up and the flooring is in. We are expanding the triplex to add much-needed space. We believe this third apartment will be done by the end of June. Then, Torres is going to work on a barn for our tractor and implements so they don't get rusted out. After that, he will start our ten-year project to build a 48,000-square-foot hospital.

Navoth and his two brothers will, in May, be completing the add-on to our pulperia, which is a small grocery store and bakery. Our workers definitely needed the space, and our engineer fixed our plumbing problem. Hallelujah! Also, at the beginning of May, the crew will begin work on the roof and the electrical wiring of the music and art rooms. Then, they will do the floors, plaster the walls, and paint. After that, they will begin to build a strip mall, which will be 36 feet by almost 200 feet.

Rodolfo has installed the windows in the butcher shop. Hallelujah! We have sent \$5,000 to finish the chain-link fence of the volleyball court and the roof on the girls orphanage. God is good!

Moises has finished the security fence and is working on an addition to the boys dorms. The block work and the walls are finished. Then they will work on the roof, electrical, plastering, and painting. He should finish by June 1st. Now that the windows are finished, Moises will be tiling the 2000-square-foot butcher shop. He should be finished sometime in June. His next project will be building housing on our farms across the river. The number one problem we have in agriculture is "two-legged coyotes". Besides giving people homes, the thieves will see that we have people with eyes. The first one will be next to the gate. People constantly come in and cut our trees, and in the past, they would steal our grain.

Julio has the flooring done on our third pool for our tourism project. They are beginning to build the walls. We hope to make the City of Refuge a tourist destination. This will be a sixteen-month project that will put us on the tourism map in Honduras.

Short-term projects are a tractor barn to get our implements out of the rain and hot sun and a storage building to store our building supplies. Currently, we are storing our building supplies in a large room that is in our hotel. This would free up another room for missionaries. Potentially, we could have almost twenty hotel rooms.

Future long-term projects Three-story high school and college to train agriculture, Bible, computer and business • hospital • fifteen-room hotel • tourism activities • soccer field • baseball diamond • volleyball court • strip mall • church

Ongoing projects More barns • more housing for the poor • walls to enclose property • more homes for single moms • more homes for orphans

Big dream fulfilled Our greenhouse is in full operation. In April, we planted cucumbers, radishes, tomatoes, and beets. We have already begun to reap radishes. Hallelujah!

52-acre farm Our farmer has cleared the fifth section of land, removing the trees and thorn bushes and burning the weeds and seeds. They are now working on our sixth section of land. Should the Lord continue to bless us, our goal is to have eleven parcels to rotate the cows every three days to fresh green Mombasa grass which has 450% more protein than Honduran grass. God is good!

Beans harvested, and we were able to take our own beans and plant them again We didn't have to buy beans to plant. Just like they used to do it. We just planted another acreage of corn and beans and they are growing. Hallelujah!

New farm babies We had three more baby calves – two males and one female. A baby goat was born this April and almost forty baby pigs since March. Glory to God!

Tilapia The tilapia tanks are finished, but they leak. So we have to spend \$1,800 per tank to put membranes on them to seal them. Bummer! But we live and learn. Three of the ponds are in operation, and the fourth will be ready in May.

Eggs are selling so fast, we cannot keep up These are some of the biggest eggs I have ever seen. They are about fifty percent bigger than large eggs in the USA. The new chickens are laying eggs like crazy. We still can't keep up with the demand in the store. We now have 800 hens laying 500 to 600 eggs a day. Our new chicken barns can house up to 2,000 chickens.

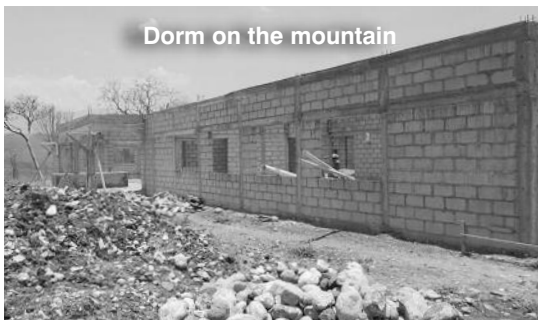
Fruit trees We are currently harvesting our guavas, and the mangoes are now growing. Hallelujah!

Mega project in Wisconsin – sixteen acres and over 40,000 square feet of buildings Over the years, I have been criticized for not helping people in America. Despite having

over 185 people housed a week or more in our personal house, running a grocery and thrift store, speaking over 13,000 times, mentoring people and loving people, I still get criticized. Oh well! It has been on my heart to help women and children being abused and ladies sold into the sex trade to have a safe house. We have bought 25 acres in a distant corner in the USA, but development is a couple of years away unless, of course, the Lord provides faster than I am believing for. Within months, we believe we will be able to rescue girls NOW!!! They can't wait; they need help NOW!!! We are partnering with Pastor Jared Pierson from Portage, Wisconsin. We are buying sixteen acres with an old, two-story barn (4,000 square feet on each floor), another 4,500-square-foot pole barn, a three-bedroom house and a building with 50-plus rooms (25,000 square feet). It was a nursing home that closed a number of years ago, and a cult had bought it. We want to redeem it for the glory of God. My partner, Pastor Jared, already operates a successful rehabilitation project in Portage. They are selling their beautiful house and moving onto the property.

Our goals are to protect abused women and children, help dysfunctional people become functional, have conferences, become self-sufficient by raising dogs and gardens, board horses to earn money and bring healing to the hurting, and develop other streams of income to help orphanages. We need your prayers for protection; for wisdom and angelic help; finances to pay for building and remodeling; food, clothing, furniture, housewares, hygiene, toys and games; tractor to mow grass and plow snow; workers to volunteer and remodel the buildings (the former people trashed it); decorators to make it beautiful; business partners to develop income streams and earn money; building supplies; counselors; and YOU! As we head home to the USA later this month, please pray/respond to the following needs: * Our traveling and safety * our finances – we have to raise all the funds for our expenses in Belize that amounts to well over \$60,000 annually * people and places to share * for our son who gets married on the 17th * for us because we leave our daughter, Kristy, in the States for college. **Marriage Advice

Reasons to seek marriage counseling

● **When communication has become negative.**

Once communication has deteriorated, often it is hard to get it going back in the right direction. Negative communication can include anything that leaves one partner feeling depressed, insecure or disregarded, or wanting to withdraw from the conversation. This can also include the tone of the conversation. It is important to remember that it's not always what you say, but how you say it. Negative communication can include any verbal or nonverbal communication that not only leads to hurt feelings, but emotional or physical abuse.

● **When the couple seems to be "just occupying the same space".** When couples become more like roommates than a married couple, this may indicate a need for counseling. This does not mean that if the couple isn't doing everything together that they are in trouble. If there is a lack of communication, conversation and intimacy or any other elements the couple feels are important and they feel they are just "co-existing", this may be an indication that a skilled clinician can help sort out what is missing and how to get it back.

● **When the partners do not know how to resolve their differences.** When a couple begins to experience discord and they are aware of the discord, knowing is only half the battle. Many times I have heard couples say, "We know what's wrong, but we just don't know how to fix it." This is a perfect time to get a third party involved. If a couple is stuck, a skilled counsellor may be able to get them moving in the right direction.
