

During the past year, I had a man with a Colt 45 come to a meeting near Kansas City intending to shoot me, plus, we have had to battle the equivalent of the FBI and Child Protection Services in Honduras, the IRS, the police, Rice county in Minnesota and the Honduras government, all at the same time. Most Christians won't face any of these battles in a lifetime. We faced all of them in a four-month time span.

Here are some practical things you can do in "the heat of the battle!"

- ▶ Cry out to God with all of your heart and examine yourself to see if there is anything you are doing that may have opened up the door to the devil. If you have opened up the door, repent and ask God for forgiveness.
- ▶ Recruit prayer warriors – humble yourself and get as many prayer warriors as you can. Some battles are won by sheer numbers.
- ▶ Be prepared. People that you think would be on your side will actually join the other side. They may be Job's accusers. They may assume "where there is smoke, there is fire". They will come against you. Be prepared to forgive those who spitefully use you.
- ▶ Remember the song, "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in His wonderful face, and the things of earth will grow strangely dim, in the light of His glory and grace." Your worship is your warship. Read II Chronicles 20. Giving thanks to God and worshiping Him invites His powerful presence and angelic hosts to help you fight the battle.
- ▶ Encourage yourself with scriptures and powerful quotes, such as Isaiah 54:17, "No weapon formed against you will prosper," or, "Having done everything to stand, stand!" James Hudson Taylor said, "There are three stages to every great work of God; first it is impossible, then it is difficult, then it is done."
- ▶ Exercise, eat right and get your sleep. Don't let an undisciplined lifestyle take over. You need to be at the top of your game.
- ▶ Surround yourselves with the best people. We hired an incredible attorney that helped us push back the enemy. We hired a psychologist, a social worker, educators, and accountants that all helped us to shut the mouths of the lions.
- ▶ Be full of faith and full of wisdom. It's not one or the other, it's both. Believe God for the best, but plan for the worst.
- ▶ If you look like you are losing the war, go fight a battle that you know you can win.
- ▶ Forgive your enemies and don't let a root of bitterness come into your heart.
- ▶ Watch your mouth; it has the power of life and of death.
- ▶ Don't blame God; blame the devil. We wrestle not against flesh and blood.
- ▶ Pay back the devil.
- ▶ Remember that life is temporal; focus on God and eternity.

After going through one nightmare after another, we decided to build a Bible camp that will bring more people to Jesus than anything we have ever done.

The children are getting better in their behavior. God is showing us how to deal with tragedies. The children have 50 lp allowance. From that they get to save some, like 30lp, and they can spend 20 in the store. If they misbehave, don't do their chores or do other bad things, they get less money. They like that plan. They feel motivated to do better every day, and the 30 lempiras they save will go towards buying a computer in college. Thank God, finally they are fulfilling their destiny.

Pam, a long-term missionary from Wisconsin, is teaching the girls to make jewelry. They are very excited. Last week, she gave a teaching to the boys about how batteries work. She said the boys were very interested to know more.

September is the month we celebrate Independence Day. The kids are preparing for parades and are having a lot of activities.

**Missionaries** In September, we are having Chaplain Rex and Rev. Pina Hipp and their daughter from Oklahoma. Rex is a chaplain at the military base in Oklahoma. Aaron and Lynda Ehlers from North Dakota are coming back a second time. Their son came on a missions trip three years ago, and because of a brain tumor, he is now with Jesus. They donated one hundred of our fruit trees. Also, Cody and Pam are enjoying their stay.

**Great news: Joshua Otte is back** in Honduras as of September 6th. Joshua is doing an incredible job for us in Honduras. He leads the mission trips and helps out Mama Teresa. He has a great attitude and does well relating to the children. He is back for almost three months for his second long-term mission adventure. He will be leaving just before Thanksgiving to come back to Nebraska for the holidays. Please keep this valuable soldier in your prayers.

**New exciting project – new building for the best behaved kids** The kids and Joshua are excited about getting back to work. The trenching is finished. The next step is to put in the footings. By the time the building is finished, our boys will know all aspects of how to build a building.

**To sponsor a poor child to go to school, it's \$20 per month or \$200 a year** 100% of the monies goes to the school and **ZERO** goes to Tom and Teresa. Sponsors will get updates and emails from the children. If you believe in education, then this is a great opportunity for you to help a child and change the world through bilingual Christian education.



**Help a child to go to college** Currently, Adriana, our eldest daughter in the orphanage (whose mother and sisters are prostitutes), is in her third year of medical school. IMI is looking for seven sponsors for \$100 a month or two sponsors for \$350 a month or one sponsor for \$700 a month. Life is getting more expensive there and schooling even more. **Sports** It may surprise you that my second favorite sport to play is volleyball. My wife and I and the missionaries love playing volleyball, soccer and other sports. Pray that we are able to build more sports facilities so people can find Jesus.

**Corn and beans** We had to replant corn as someone let their cows into our cornfield. We are getting ready to harvest our first crop on the ten acres we cleared last fall. Each month we plant three to five acres of land with corn and beans. By the end of the year, our harvest will supply beans for the orphanage and corn for the tortillas and for the livestock.

**52-acre farm update** – The first section, out of ten, has been developed into productive pasture, and we have sent the money for section two.

**62 acre farm** – We have planted another hundred fruit trees in the month of September.

## HONDURAS HIGHLIGHTS

### Building projects in the months of August and September

Our six contractors and our electrician/welder/maintenance man with his crew are busy. A number of years ago, my good friend Rev. Brian Grey, pointed out in a video "another unfinished project by IMI". That important goal has helped me to not just start projects but to finish them. When someone is a visionary, it's challenging to finish present projects before going on to future ones. By the end of September, we will be finishing some long-term projects. Hallelujah!

**Torres** – By the end of September, Torres will have finished up the tile and the ceiling in the duplex. We have sent \$5,000 to put in the doors and windows. All we have left is the plumbing, the sewage system and the painting, and two families from the garbage dump are going to be blessed. This has been a year-long process. As soon as Torres is finished with the tile, he will work on the large two-bedroom house that has been built for a pastor and a family. It will also be used for housing missionaries. We have sent \$5,000 to work on tiling that house. When the tile is finished, we will go on to the windows, doors, plumbing and sewage system, and that house will be finished. We started that house back in 2015. As God provides, Torres will then continue to focus on building apartments for the poor.

**Omar** – As of September 1, our contractor is putting on the roof of our industrial arts building. This very important building will be finished by the end of September. Purposes: (1) It will be a welding room for our contractors. (2) Our boys will learn how to do welding. (3) Our furniture maker will be working on furniture. (4) Our boys will be learning to make furniture. (5) It will be a storage shed for our tools. This was a \$20,000 investment, and we believe it will pay off quickly. After this is completed, Omar will concentrate on building dorms for the Bible camp.

**Navoth and his two brothers** – *The boys dorms are completely remodeled except for the outside walls.* This was a six-month-long project, and it has been completed. Praise God! This was our ugliest building, and now, it looks new. In July, we sent \$5,000 to begin building the art room, music room and an extra classroom that is much needed. There will also be a room for younger boys to sleep. One of the extra rooms will be used for the educator to sleep at night. In August and September, we sent another \$10,000 to continue the process of building the rooms. We project that these buildings will be finished in October or November. Also, each month we are sending \$1,000 to work on the roof for the laundry room. This is a huge room with a dozen sinks to wash clothes. They are about ¼ done. Can you imagine trying to dry your clothes when it rains almost everyday?

**Moises** – In the last two months, we have sent \$8,400 to build a ten by thirty-meter greenhouse. It's a monster and is as big as our girls dorms and the school. This is a two-month project. I believe the greenhouse will be big enough to raise all of our vegetables. It will help keep bugs, diseases and rodents out. There are numerous purposes for the greenhouse: (1) To become self-sufficient (2) To get as close as we can to raising organic veggies (3) To teach our students how agriculture is done (4) To teach college and high school students from the communities agriculture from a Christian perspective (5) To create jobs. Currently, the footings and a two-block high wall is around the perimeter and the studs and the trusses are up. We are right on schedule to finish it by the end of September. Next, Moises will be building our butcher shop.

**Julio** – Our team-building pool for our Bible camp now has the flooring cement done and they are working on the walls. We are projecting to finish by the end of September. This pool will be used for volleyball, basketball and water polo team activities. The pool is also good for baptizing people. After this, Julio will be building four large tanks to raise tilapia and send the gray water to the plants in the greenhouse.

**Butcher shop** We have the location of the butcher shop; now we just need the resources to build it. We project that we will start the building October 1st. If you want to help, please put **butcher shop** on your offering.

# Healthy Teaching by Dr. Teresa

## It's not your fault that you are struggling with your weight

Thousands of years ago, there was no obesity or type 2DM diabetes. Just getting enough to eat was a struggle. We had to forage most of the day for food, finding some roots here, and some vegetables and berries there. If you found a whole bush full of ripe berries, you ate them right away. Who knew when there would be more?

In those days, being overweight would have meant you were an extremely successful member of the tribe. It would have taken a lot of ambition back then to have a body mass index (BMI) above 25. When we hear someone say, "I went to a party, and suddenly, I'd eaten a whole bag of potato chips," or "I was watching TV, and I ate a whole pint of ice cream," we think, of course, their body was designed that way. Faced with so much nutritional energy right in front of you, your ancient biological programming insisted that you eat it all, especially with your conscious mind distracted by TV or a party. Ancient humans used all their energy just staying alive. If they wanted to go somewhere, they had to walk or run or paddle a canoe. If they wanted to eat, they had to grind grasses and grains, carry water, gather wood, build a fire and cook their meat. So our bodies evolved to be extremely efficient at using energy. If they hadn't, no one would have survived.

To this day, our bodies fight to hold onto every calorie of energy we take in, because that's how we are programmed – as if our survival is still in question.

### The storage factor

Our bodies are designed to store and conserve fat and calories for those times we can't find food. Let's start with some facts.

- In the U.S. alone, excess weight, obesity, and inactivity are reportedly responsible for about 300,000 deaths every day.
- Complications from obesity – including increased risk of coronary heart disease, type 2 diabetes, stroke, osteoarthritis, and certain cancers – now count for 9% all health care cost.
- Surveys indicate that at least 66% of American adults are now overweight or obese and that obesity is increasing at an even faster pace among children. As a result, the coming generation may have a shorter life span than their parents for the first time in American history.

Our energy storage system is made up of over 40 million adipose (fat) cells, providing a virtually unlimited storehouse to keep us alive. We also store small amounts of carbohydrates in our liver and muscles. The ability to stockpile energy as fat is our most critical survival mechanism. We are here today because our ancestors' bodies stored fat so well thousands of years ago.

In this twenty-first century, getting food takes almost no effort at all. You drive to supermarket, throw packages into a cart, roll the cart to your car, transfer the packages and drive home. How much energy does that take?

How about "hunting" and "gathering" at your local fast food restaurant? In about three minutes or so, it's all eaten. Let's do the math. Out of 1,500 calories consumed, twelve are expended as energy. What is wrong with this picture?

### The supersize generation

You probably noticed that in the past twenty years, service sizes have gotten bigger and bigger. Restaurant portions are

as much as eight times the standard serving size in the FDA's dietary guidelines. Eight times! Just as an example, at a steakhouse restaurant, they take a seventy-calorie, wonderful, nutritious root vegetable, full of vitamins and antioxidants, and transform it into a 2,400-calorie fat meal – and that is just the appetizer. The calories consumed and calories used are way out of whack in our world. Today we are surrounded by food that's portioned larger and more dense in calories than anything imagined even fifty years ago. At the same time, our labor-saving devices let us conserve energy at an unprecedented rate. No wonder over two-thirds of Americans take in more calories than they can ever use!

It is not your fault that you were born in a time of unparalleled plenty and physical ease with a body that stores and conserves energy. It is not your fault that you're confronted by food that's more plentiful and addictive than at any time in history, with a day-to-day lifestyle that most often finds us in a chair at our desk or on the couch in front of the TV.

### How the food industry sabotages your health

The food industry is not your friend. Between sodas and snacks, the average American consumes twenty-six spoonfuls of refined sugar every day. Yet your body only needs the equivalent of one teaspoon of sugar to operate your entire bloodstream. Each American consumes an average of 135 pounds of sugar each year. That's an increase of 26 pounds per person in just the past 25 years! Just think, a century ago, our average consumption was five pounds per year.

Why in the first century, does food have so much sugar in it? Because sugar makes food taste good, and food companies want to produce food that sells. In the old days, businesses made profits offering high quality food that earned customer loyalty. If the local butcher sold you a bad piece of meat, you stopped using him and let everybody in town know it. The food industry was very personal. But as food became big business, the focus moved from quality to cost. Who's running the food industry now? People who look at accounts, mostly. They don't love food, they love numbers. Lower costs mean bigger profits. One way to cut costs is to get a better deal from suppliers by buying in larger quantities. Another way to cut costs is to use cheaper ingredients at a higher volume.

In the early 1980's, Pepsi and Coke replaced sugar with high fructose corn syrup. Why? Because it was cheaper. Now soft drink companies could supersize an eight-ounce bottle and offer 64 ounces for the same price! That is a great "value" for you.

Sugar or sucrose can be metabolized by any cell in the body, while high fructose corn syrup can only be processed by your liver, after which it is turned into triglycerides, and then, lays down as fat. On top of that, high fructose syrup is very addictive. Your body gets used to it and starts to crave it. High fructose corn syrup is even worse than sugar because it keeps your body from producing key hormones that regulate your energy cycle and inhibit hunger. So, your body can't even sense when it's full. But, it all catches up with you. One day, you go to the doctor and discover that you are prediabetic, or worse, already have diabetes or liver disease.

We need to be aware of what we are battling and determine what are some good methods to win the battle.
